This study "**INDUSTRIAL POLICY IN AN OPEN AND COMPETITIVE ENVIRONMENT - GUIDELINES FOR A COMMUNITY APPROACH**", European Parliament, Brussels 1991, was presented at an international seminar; an important contribution to the new chapter within the Maastricht Treaty. President Delors and Vice-President Bangemann acknowledged in a letter the importance of this report which has subsequently been published in a Special Edition of the European Parliament.
