EXPLANATORY NOTE

The provisions of article 21 (1) (b) of the Council Directive 70/457/EEC of 29 September 1970 on the common catalogue of varieties of agricultural plant species (1), as last amended by Council Directive 73/438/EEC of 11 December 1973 (2) and the provisions of article 32 (1) (b) of the Council Directive 70/458/EEC of 29 September 1970 on the marketing of vegetable seed (3), as last amended by Council Directive 76/307/EEC of 15 March (4) provide for that, with regard to the varieties being maintained in third countries.

The checks on practices for the maintenance carried out in these third countries, have to be recognized as being equivalent to the checks on practices carried out in the Member States.

In the case of 9 third countries, the examination of the checks of practices for the maintenance carried out in these countries has shown that the equivalence can be granted.

This equivalence allows, <sup>to</sup> the Member States to accept officially the varieties of the third countries concerned.

Proposal for a second

Council Decision amending the Annex to Fifth Council Decision 76/539/EEC on the equivalence of seed produced in third countries

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Directive 66/400/EEC of 14 June 1966 on the marketing of beet seed (1), as last amended by Directive 76/331/EEC (2), and in particular Article 16 (1) (b) thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 66/401/EEC of 14 June 1966 on the marketing of fodder plant seed (3), as last amended by Directive 75/444/EEC (4), and in particular Article 16 (1) (b) thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 66/402/EEC of 14 June 1966 on the marketing of cereal seed (5), as last amended by Directive 75/444/EEC, and in particular Article 16 (1) (b) thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 69/208/EEC of 30 June 1969 on the marketing of seed of oil and fibre plants (6), as last amended by Directive 75/444/EEC, and in particular Article 15 (1) (b) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas by Council Decision 76/539/EEC of 17 May 1976 (7) equivalence has been granted for seed of 20 third countries ;

Whereas for certain species this equivalence relates also to New Zealand ;

Whereas in the meantime it has been established that there are rules on seed control for a range of plant species also in Cyprus and the German Democratic Republic ;

Whereas an examination of the rules of the abovementioned countries and of the manner in which they are applied has shown that the conditions governing certain seed harvested and controlled in these countries afford the same assurances as regards the seed's characteristics, identity, examination, marking and control, as do the conditions applicable to seed harvested and controlled within the Community ;

Whereas Cyprus and the German Democratic Republic should therefore also be granted equivalence and the existing equivalence for New Zealand should be extended to sugar beet ;

Whereas, moreover, the "Special Conditions" have to be adapted to the special circumstances of the abovementioned countries ;

Whereas this Decision does not affect the provisions laid down in the Protocol on German International Trade and connected problems,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION :

Article 1

With effect from 1 July 1978, there shall be added to the Annex to Decision 76/539/EEC the entries set out in the Annex hereto.

Article 2

The "Special Conditions" in the annex to Decision 76/539/EEC shall be amended as follows :

1. The following shall be substituted for item 4 :

"4. In the case of certified seed or certified seed of the first generation, the basic seed and, in the case of certified seed of the second and subsequent generations, the certified seed of the preceding generation or generations :

- (a) shall have been officially controlled or certified in a third country which has been granted equivalence in the same way for the same species or within the Community ;
- (b) shall have been officially certified within the Community.";

2. The following shall be added after item 4 :

"4 A. In the case of basic seed, the seed of the preceding generation has been officially controlled within the Community in accordance with the provisions applicable for the certification of basic seed."

3. The following shall be added after item 13 :

"14. The seed has been produced on official premises."

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Directive 66/400/EEC of 14 June 1966 on the marketing of beet seed (1), as last amended by Directive 76/331/EEC (2), and in particular Article 16 (1) (a) thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 66/401/EEC of 14 June 1966 on the marketing of fodder plant seed (3), as last amended by Directive 75/444/EEC (4), and in particular Article 16 (1) (a) thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 66/402/EEC of 14 June 1966 on the marketing of cereal seed (5), as last amended by Directive 75/444/EEC, and in particular Article 16 (1) (a) thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 69/208/EEC of 30 June 1969 on the marketing of seed of oil and fibre plants (6), as last amended by Directive 75/444/EEC, and in particular Article 15 (1) (a) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas by Council Decision 76/538/EEC of 17 May 1976 (7) equivalence has been granted for field inspections on seed-producing crops of 20 third countries;

Whereas for certain species this equivalence relates also to New Zealand;

Whereas in the meantime it has been established that there are rules on seed control for a range of plant species also in Cyprus and the German Democratic Republic which provide for official field inspection carried out during the period of seed production ;

Whereas an examination of the rules of the abovementioned countries and of the manner in which they are applied has shown that the prescribed field inspections satisfy the conditions laid down in Annex I to each of the abovementioned Directives ;

Whereas, moreover, the "Special Conditions" have to be adapted to the special circumstances of the abovementioned countries ;

Whereas this Decision does not affect the provisions laid down in the Protocol on German International Trade and connected problems,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION :

Article 1

With effect from 1 July 1978, there shall be added to the Annex to Decision 76/538/EEC, the entries set out in the Annex hereto.

Article 2

The "Special conditions" in the annex to Decision 76/538/EEC shall be amended as follows :

The following shall be added after item 6 :

"7. The seed has been produced on official premises.".

; Proposal for a Council Decision on the Equivalence of the Checks  
on Practices for the Maintenance of Varieties carried out in Third countries.

The Council of the European Communities,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Directive 70/457/EEC of 29 September 1970 on the common catalogue of varieties of agricultural plant species (1), as last amended by Council Directive 73/438/EEC of 11 December 1973 (2), and in particular Article 21 (1) (b) thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 70/458/EEC of 29 September 1970 on the marketing of vegetable seed (3), as last amended by Council Directive 76/307/EEC of 15 March 1976 (4), and in particular Article 32 (1) (b) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas in Canada, the German Democratic Republic, Spain, Hungary, New Zealand, Poland, Sweden, the United States of America and South Africa varieties officially accepted in the Community must be maintained according to accepted practices for the maintenance of the variety;

Whereas such practices are or may be officially checked in those countries;

Whereas in examination of the conditions of official checks has shown that the checks on practices for the maintenance of varieties carried out in the said countries afford the same assurances as those carried out by the Member States;

Whereas this Decision does not preclude the Community findings being revoked or the extension of their period of validity being refused, when the conditions on which they are based are not or cease to be satisfied;

Whereas, to this end, further practical information on seed of the varieties being maintained in the abovementioned countries should be obtained by growing and checking samples of such seed in comparative Community tests;

Whereas it has become apparent that certain technical and administrative provisions in the Annex are subject to frequent amendment;

Whereas for the purpose of simplifying the procedure which at present governs amendments to the Annex, it seems desirable that such amendments should be referred to the procedure of the Standing Committee on Seeds and Propagating Material for Agriculture, Horticulture and Forestry,

Whereas this Decision does not affect the provisions laid down in the Protocol on German International Trade and connected problems,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION :

Article 1

It is hereby noted that the checks carried out in the countries listed in the Annex hereto, as regards practices for the maintenance of the varieties listed in the said Annex in respect of the said countries, afford the same assurances as those carried out by the Member States.

Article 2

Technical and administrative amendments to be made to the Annex, with the exception of those concerning column 2 of the table, shall be adopted in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 23 of Directive 70/457/EEC and in Article 40 of Directive 70/458/EEC.

Article 3

A finding as set out in Article 1 shall be withdrawn if it is established that the conditions therefor are no longer being satisfied.

Article 4

This Decision shall apply from 1 July 1977 to 30 June 1987.

Article 5

This Decision is addressed to the Member States.
