The report gives the most recently available data on the overall balance of payments (quarterly and annual flows) for each of the Member States of the European Community and for the Community as a whole (sums of EUR 9 and EUR 10), for each of the countries applying for membership (Spain and Portugal) and also for the United States and Japan.

Comparative tables for the main headings of balances of payments of industrialized countries are also included.

All these data are set out here according to a layout based on the one suggested in the fourth edition of the International Monetary Fund's publication 'Balance of payments manual'. The series are expressed in European currency units (ECU) and contain the most recent three years for which data are available for annual flows and the most recent nine quarters for which data are available for quarterly flows.

The publication is divided into three parts:

- I Summary tables
- II Tables by heading
- III Tables by country.

NEWS ITEMS

The growing importance of the Community in world statistics

Over the years the Commission has tended more and more to speak and negotiate on behalf of the Community as a whole. In a wide variety of contexts—Lomé Convention, GATT, North-South Dialogue, Madrid Conference, trade talks with Israel, etc.—statistics have had an important, sometimes essential, role to play.

For Eurostat this has involved two tasks. Firstly, to ensure that the Commission has adequate statistics for the Community as a whole. Secondly, to see that there is the appropriate level of comparability between Community statistics and those of the other countries and groups of countries.

The second task implies active and concerted participation by Eurostat (and the national statistical services of the Member States) in the work of the international statistical organizations.

Recently, Eurostat's status in this international work has grown considerably. To take only five examples:

- (i) The Community has taken the lead in the work on world nomenclatures—fundamental to analysis of the connections between trade flows, production and employment.
- (ii) Long experience within the Community in price comparisons and the calculation of purchasing-power parities between Member States has given Eurostat a major role to play in the world international price comparison project—an essential project if international comparisons, particularly the assessment of aid to developing countries, is not to be distorted, as now, by erratic movements in external exchange rates.
- (iii) By the on-line dissemination of Com-

munity statistics through the Euronet network, Eurostat has taken full advantage of the new technologies. National and international organizations alike are profiting from our example and initiative.

- (iv) A new joint initiative in the field of inflation accounting by Eurostat and OECD has been welcomed by international statisticians. More generally in the field of national accounts Eurostat has formulated proposals which could point the way towards a better world system of national accounting, in particular closing some of the gaps between practices in the planned and the market economies.
- (v) By the increase in unsolicited visits to Luxembourg by heads of statistical offices (recent visitors have included those from the United States of America and Sweden), experts and trainees from all over the world.

The reasons for the increased prestige of Community statistical work in a world context are not difficult to find:

- (a) the growing cooperation and identity of views between Member States and Eurostat on major statistical problems;
- (b) the progress made by the Community in developing its own system of timely, reliable and relatively homogeneous figures;
- (c) enlargement: ten Member States, with active cooperation from Spain and Portugal, now represent a major bloc in an international statistical context;
- (d) increasing efforts of the major organizations, UN, OECD, ECE and EEC, to cooperate, avoid duplication, and to share essential work.

Against such a background, Eurostat's involvement in international statistical work may be expected to increase. Fortunately, in many sectors involvement can be limited and initiatives left to other organizations.

Accordingly, the limited resources available for this work can be concentrated on these sectors which are of high priority for the Community and where Community initiatives are essential.

Short-term industrial indicators

In May 1972 the Council adopted a directive providing for 'the organization of coordinated statistical inquiries into the business cycle in industry and the handicrafts'. It is now appropriate to take a look back at the work that has been done in the field of short-term industrial indicators. It is hardly necessary to point out that the availability of harmonized, coherent and up-to-date data on the short-term economic situation in industry, both aggregated and broken down by industrial branches, constitutes an essential tool for the analysis of short-term and long-term trends in industry and for the formulation of economic policy, not only at the Community level, but even at the national level.

Rapid key indicators

More precisely, the whole set of indicators available to Eurostat in the form of indices (1975 = 100) at the national and Community level consists of the variables listed below.

• The production index is the main indicator, because of the speed with which it is produced (published two months at the latest after the reference month) and the scope of its coverage of industrial branches (approximately 40 branches, or groups of branches, according to the NACE classification); it measures volume changes in industrial production and can be used to trace the trend at constant prices of that part of the

gross domestic product contributed by industry.

- The turnover and new orders indices: these indices can be used to follow trends in demand and thus to forecast future trends in production. The statistics for orders are in principle only collected for those industries that are supposed to manufacture products on a 'to order' basis.
- The so-called 'social' indicators, that is to say:
- the index of the number of employees;
- the index of the number of manual workers:
- the index of gross wages and salaries (total remunerations);
- the work volume index (hours of work theoretically or actually worked by manual workers).

It goes without saying that the behaviour of these last variables is closely connected to fluctuations in the production index. The social indicators, just like the indicators for turnover and orders, have in general a narrower coverage of branches than the production index. Nevertheless, the coverage of indicators such as the turnover index and the number of workers is very close to that of the production index, which means that they are the most appropriate for purposes of analysis.

The present situation regarding the transmission of the statistics is summarized in the table below:

Though it may appear that there are some important gaps in this table, the considerable efforts made by the Member States to improve statistical coverage must be emphasized. Eurostat expects for instance to receive the turnover indices for France in the near future. Greece will shortly be supplying its production index according to the NACE nomenclature.

An important addition: the index of industrial producer prices

The absence of information on current prices in industry is considered a serious handicap for economic analysis. These prices provide the essential element by means of which the production index and the indices of turnover and orders can be related to each other, the production index being a volume index, whereas the latter two indices are expressed in current prices. Though one must not lose sight of the fact that in some cases the production index is obtained by expressing deliveries in terms of constant prices, comparison of the variables 'turnover', 'orders received' and

'production', duly expressed in terms of a common unit (in volume terms or at current prices), is the kind of operation that provides extremely useful information on the business cycle. In this respect, the analysis of variations in stocks of finished products and of trends in order-books are two examples worthy of note.

It is obvious that being able to follow the trend of these prices is in itself of sufficient interest to justify collecting them. This is why Eurostat, in collaboration with the Member States, has since 1977 developed a common methodology for the preparation of these price indices, which in some ways are not very different from the indices traditionally known as 'wholesale price indices'. In the case of some Member States, the preparation of these indices only involved modifying the existing compilation system, whereas other countries were obliged to set up an entirely new system of surveys. Although Eurostat is already in possession of complete sets of these indices for five Member States, the project is not expected to be completed before 1983. For the time being these indices only cover

prices used in transactions on the national market; Eurostat is at present looking into whether they are suitable for the deflator operations mentioned above.

Dissemination

The short-term economic indicators are all stocked in the 'General Economic Information' ('ICG' domain) in Cronos (Eurostat's chronological data base), and a selection of these indicators, covering the most important industrial branches, is published in the monthly publication 'Industrial short-term trends'. This publication is accompanied, from time to time, by supplements which

include detailed methodological information (e.g. Supplement No 12-1980, on the turnover indices and the indices of orders received). It is Eurostat's intention to supplement the contents of this publication during 1982 with indicators for foreign trade by industrial branches, with production indices for certain important third countries (taken from OECD sources), and also with data relating to the sector 'building and civil engineering', which is the subject of a subsequent directive by the Council providing for a range of statistical variables adapted to the particular circumstances of this sector.

The statistical programme

The EEC Commission has sent to the Council its Fifth statistical programme of the European Communities 1982-84 (COM (81) 327). The programme has also been sent, for information, to the European Parliament and to the Economic and Social Committee.

The present programme is the fifth in a series begun in 1973. The series has developed as follows:

- 1974 First programme circulated as Eurostat working document.
- 1976 Second programme 1977-79 (COM (76) 376). Approved by the Commission (COM (76) PV 378) and by the Council (R/1704/77 (ECO 191) and T/626/77 (AGRI)).
- 1977 Third programme 1978-80 circulated as Eurostat working document.
- 1978 Fourth programme 1979-81 (COM (78) 124) approved by the Commission (PV 299/78) and the Council in 1978 (R/1585/78 (ECO 133) (FIN 422) and 750/78).

It is no longer considered necessary to produce a full new programme each year for the Commission and the Council, though an annual updating will be discussed each year with the directorates-general of the national statistical institutes.

Two major innovations characterize the Fifth statistical programme of the European Communities covering the years 1982-84. These are:

- (1) the development of new data banks which will provide a basic and flexible instrument for the formulation, monitoring and administration of Community policies in most fields of high priority;
- (2) a new role for Eurostat in the dissemination of on-line information from existing and new data banks to the Community institutions and to the Community at large.

The principal aim of the Fourth programme (1979-81), that of providing timely short-term socio-economic statistics, has been largely achieved, and the basic information

requested is now in the hands of Eurostat and the national statistical services. The main problems to be solved in order to carry out the new programme are:

(i) to examine with Member States how the flow of essential statistical information can be maintained and improved, partly through the use of new telecommunications facilities, which can simplify the task of national statistical services, and partly by improved cross-sector harmonization so that maximum use can be made of all the available data;

(ii) to achieve the necessary redeployment and reinforcement of computing and other resources in order to keep total costs to a minimum.

The general lines of the programme cover the following topics: a review of the period 1979-81; the outlook for 1982-84 from the point of view of general priorities, priorities for individual sectors and technical priorities; and in the longer term, the outlook for demand and resources.

The programme contains a series of annexes the aim of which is to provide a detailed description of the individual projects mentioned.

These annexes deal with general economic statistics, demographic and social statistics, industry, transport and services statistics, agriculture, forestry and fisheries statistics, energy statistics, external trade, ACP and non-member countries statistics, Eurostat Secretariat, Liaison Bureau, data processing and dissemination.

Nomenclature of Statistical Territorial Units

On I January 1981 the SOEC published the Nomenclature of Statistical Territorial Units (NUTS) as an in-house document. This publication provides a three-level classification of the territorial units in the 10 Member States:

- Level I, comprising 54 European Community regions;
- Level II, comprising 118 basic administrative units;
- Level III, comprising 742 subdivisions of the basic administrative units.

This nomenclature is used as a standard for all Community statistics of a regional character.

Regional statistics are mainly compiled at Level II of the NUTS: economic accounts, population, employment, unemployment, education, agriculture, industry, transport and telecommunications, etc.

In addition, from this year on, the SOEC, in collaboration with national statistical departments, is compiling selected statistical indicators at Level III of the NUTS. Users interested in receiving a copy of the Nomenclature of Statistical Territorial Units may apply directly to the Regional and Financial Statistics Division of the SOEC (Tel. 4301/3288).

The publication is divided into three parts:

- Part One provides some demographic indicators relating to the elderly.
- Part Two gives the main data relating to the occupations of the elderly: whether they belong to the labour force or not and, where applicable, the main employment data.
- Part Three presents the results of the specific survey on the elderly and retirement conditions which was carried out jointly with the labour force sample survey of 1977. It permits a breakdown into pension categories (old-age, disability, direct or survivor's, etc.) and provides a statistical basis for the determination of retirement age based on the statements of individuals.

EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

This publication contains the most recent series on employment, working population, unemployment and industrial stoppages, thus bringing the 1979 edition on 'Employment and unemployment' up to date.

The basic tables on population, working population and employment are supplemented by employees in employment statistics established in accordance with the NACE classes. The tables on employment include the series published monthly by the Statistical Office plus several specific analyses and certain figures on vacancies notified and filled. Industrial stoppages are shown as the number of days lost per 1 000 employees per branch of activity.

A historical section shows the main figures in the form of chronological series, several of which date back to 1950.

An annex is added to include employment and unemployment figures in Greece, Spain and Portugal.

LABOUR FORCE SAMPLE SURVEY 1979

A labour force sample survey was carried out in the spring of 1979 in the nine Member States of the Community, pursuant to Council Regulation (EEC) No 327/79 of 19 February 1979.

In this publication, the Statistical Office of the European Communities presents the main results of the survey. Similar surveys have been conducted regularly every two years (starting in 1973), with the aim of providing comparable and harmonized statistics on employment and unemployment.

The published data cover, in particular:

- the total population of private households, the labour force and unemployed persons, by sex and age group;
- employed persons by sex, occupational status and branch of activity;
- weekly working hours;
- the main groups of persons seeking employment, by sex, reasons for seeking employment, duration of search and methods used.

The data in the following tables have been selected so as to illustrate different aspects of female economic activity.

This publication also includes summary statistics of the main characteristics of the active population by region.

DEMOGRAPHIC STATISTICS 1979

While all member countries possess highly-developed systems of demographic statistics, the wide diversity of practice with regard to the publication and presentation of results makes it very difficult to obtain comparable and up-to-date information necessary to study trends within the Community. The present publication is the fourth in an annual series designed to make good this deficiency. All the principal series of demographic statistics are covered, namely population by sex and age groups, births, deaths, migration, marriages, divorces, fertility, life expectancy and population projections. Both absolute numbers and rates are given in considerable detail for individual countries and for the Community as a whole. Data for Portugal and Spain are included using a format identical to that for member countries.





General information

The publications of the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat) are grouped according to 'themes', of which the reader will find a list below.

Eurostat News provides the public with a regular flow of information on the progress of the SOEC publications programme. The presentation is such that it is clear which publications have *just appeared* in the course of the last quarter and which are *in course of preparation* and will thus be available in the near future. There follows a list of 'periodicals', indicating their frequency of publication (monthly, quarterly, half-yearly).

The information provided on each publication is as follows: 'theme' to which the work belongs, title of volume, international classification number (ISBN or ISSN), languages in which available, format, number of pages, price and brief summary of content. For practical reasons, the price is given in only one currency, the BFR (Belgian franc) which is the legal tender in the country of publication (the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg). The price thus indicated applies when orders are placed directly with the Office for Official Publications of the European Communities (L-2985 Luxembourg, 5 rue du Commerce – postal cheque account (CCP) 19 190-81 - bank current account BIL 8-109/6003/300) and serves as a rough guide to the prices in the various national currencies in the event of purchase from the sales offices which are listed on the third page of the cover. The languages in which the publications are available are shown by

the following abbreviations: M = multilingual, i.e. in the official languages of the European Communities.

DA = Danish, DE = German, EN = English, GR = Greek, FR = French, IT = Italian, NL = Dutch

Users who wish to order publications directly from the Publications Office (or to take out subscriptions) will find an *order form* on the last page of *Eurostat News*. It need only be detached, legibly completed and sent to the address indicated.

As certain users of statistical information wish to be regularly informed of the publications produced by the Statistical Office of the European Communities, a *request for information* is provided at the second last page of this issue. If it is completed and returned to Eurostat, the sender will subsequently receive notification of our publications as they appear.
