# Basic statistics of the Community — 1981

Format 10.8 × 15.3, 205 pages, price BFR 150

The work in question is the nineteenth edition of the most widely distributed reference work published by the Statistical Office of the European Communities. It is published in seven language editions (German, English, Danish, French, Italian, Dutch and Greek).

The format and the content of the work remain unchanged. Regular readers will know that it consists of a selection from the main statistical domains covered by Eurostat:

Population, research and education, national accounts, agriculture, energy, industry, transport, external trade, prices, earnings and hours of work, social accounts, standard of living, finance, regional populations and gross domestic product.

This selection allows the comparison with a number of the other European countries, plus the USA, Japan and the USSR.

# Seminar on employment and unemployment statistics

An important seminar entitled 'The measurement of employment and unemployment for Community purposes' was held in Luxembourg from 7-10 December at the instigation of the Statistical Office of the European Communities. It was chaired by Mr J. Sexton of the Economic and Social Research Institute in Dublin, and the secretariat functions were assumed by Miss Furst, Head of Division in the Directorate for Demographic and Social Statistics, assisted by officials of Division B 1. At the inaugural session, Mr A. Dornonville de la Cour, Directorate-General of Eurostat, said

in his introductory speech that the Statistical Office's aim in organizing the seminar was to encourage people to engage in a wide-ranging review of ways of improving employment statistics. With unemployment reaching the 10 million mark, he said it was becoming increasingly vital for Europe to have at its disposal effective means for the very rapid measurement and analysis of trends. He went on to say that this was possible given the right kind of joint goodwill on the part of the Member States' civil services, statistical institutes and professional and trade union organizations, Community

institutions like Eurostat and international organizations such as the OECD, the ILO, etc.

Several papers were given in the course of the seminar, the most important of which apart from those on the statistics needed for the Community's employment, labour market and economic and social policies—were the papers given by Miss Hildegard Fürst, Head of SOEC Division B 1, on European employment and unemployment statistics, by Professor Maddison of the University of Groningen on a proposal for a comprehensive approach to official statistics, by Mr L. Revher of the Institut für Arbeitsmarktund Berufsforschung on stocks and flows determining the labour market, by Messrs W.P. Leunis and C.G. Verhage from the Centraal Bureau voor de Statistiek in The Hague on the methodology of calculating

the volume of work, by Professor J. Zighera of the University of Paris-Nanterre on the present availability and future improvements needed in statistics from labour force surveys, by Mr G. McLeod of Gwilym Jenkins and Parners Ltd on the use of available statistics as a basis for forecasting employment in the Community, and by Mr I. Macredie of Statistics Canada on the estimation of gross flows from the Canadian labour force survey. Those taking part in the seminar then had a chance to discuss a number of subjects of the utmost interest to statisticians and to the users of statistics of this kind.

'Eurostat News' will of course be producing a detailed record of the work of this seminar in due course.

# Trade between the European Community and the countries of Latin America

The Statistical Office of the EC has recently published a study entitled 'Analysis of trade between the European Community and the countries of Latin America'. The following article summarizes the main findings of this study.

#### Latin America and world trade

The total trade of the Latin America countries increased nearly sixfold in value between 1970 and 1980. However, while imports increased at an average compound annual rate (20%) which matched the expansion of world trade (reference is to world trade excluding intra-Community trade) in the same period, exports increased at a slightly lower rate (approximately 18%).

Imports to Latin America accounted for about 6% of world trade including oil in

both 1970 and 1980, whereas exports dropped from 6% to just under 5%. These figures, which show that Latin America's external trade has remained fairly stable or has diminished slightly, are specially interesting when compared with the data concerning the developing countries as a whole (among whom the Latin American countries are included), as the developing countries world exports rose from 22% in 1970 to 34% in 1980 and imports went up from 23% to 30% in the same period.

Only one year (1973) has not produced a deficit in the balance of trade, the worst year being 1975 when the deficit soared to \$ 9 626 million. This figure was more than halved the following year when, as a result of the recession in some industrialized nations, the prices of manufactured goods, did not rise as much as the prices of foodstuffs

and raw materials. A reversal of this pattern occurred in 1980. Initial estimates indicate that for the first time for five years the trade balance for the Latin American countries is in surplus (+USD 700 m).

# Trade between LA 20 and EUR 10

The table below gives a more detailed picture of the growth and structure of trade between EUR 10 and LA 20 in the last 16 years.

The table shows that trade relations between the Community and Latin America were characterized (apart from a brief interlude in the middle of the 1970s) by a constant increase in terms of absolute value and a generally negative trade balance for the Community.

In this context three important trends are evident:

• Community exports grew at a faster rate than imports until the end of the first half of the 1970s.

- Despite the substantial growth in trade in terms of absolute value, Latin America's share of the Community's external trade has, as already indicated, fallen steadily. Imports from LA 20, as a percentage of total Community imports, fell from 8.7% in 1965 to 5.1% in 1980 and there was a similar though less pronounced pattern on the export side (from 6.2% in 1965 to 5.4% in 1980).
- In the case of Latin America's share of Community imports, it is particularly significant to note the sharp fall towards the middle of the 1970s, after which the area's share more or less stabilized at around 3/5 of the 1965 level. In order to assess more accurately the significance and causes of this trading pattern and to understand the fluctuations in the rate of increase, the following factors have to be borne in mind:
- a) Worldwide exports of raw materials (which account for 80% of total Latin

American exports), apart from petroleum, tended to increase at a distinctly slower rate than exports of manufactured goods, at least until 1973. Until before the 1973 oil crisis there was in fact a slightly more noticeable drop in Latin America's share of Community trade with the developing countries (in which there was a less significant proportion of manufactured goods.

b) The increased proportion, after 1973, of Community petroleum imports (of which only a very modest percentage comes from Latin America) had two effects:

- it had an adverse effect, on the import side, on the Member States' balance of trade by curbing their willingness to import;
- it swelled the value of total Community imports (extra EUR 10) and, especially, the value of imports from the developing countries; this was bound to have an effect on Latin America's share of Community imports.

# Monthly bulletin on the consumer price index

From February 1982 Eurostat intends to publish each month an extended consumer price index for the member countries as well as for Spain, Portugal, Sweden, the United States and Japan. This bulletin will present not only price indices but also the rates of increase over one month and over 12 months. The index for Ireland will refer only to the months of February, May, August and October of each year. Given the importance of the consumer price index as a short term indicator a short comment will be given in the bulletin concerning the latest development of the consumer price index.

Price indices for the main groups of consumption are provided in separate tables.

These refer to food, drinks and tobacco, clothing and footwear, rents, heating and lighting, household goods and services, transport, communication, leisure entertainment and other goods and services as well as a special group for fuel and power.

All indices use 1975 as the base year. Indices for EUR 10 and EUR 9 are calculated by weighting the national indices with the real values derived from the purchasing power parities of 1975 for household consumption in each country.

## **CRONOS** training seminar

To take stock of the first year of on-line availability of CRONOS, to provide the host with better information on the content of Eurostat's chronological data banks, to ascertain users' opinions, to examine the problems arising as regards cooperation between the Statistical Office and the host—these were the aims of the two-day training seminar which the Statistical Office organized in December for the economists of the CISI (Compagnie Internationale des Services en Informatique) and its own officials who are in charge of the various 'sefs'.

This two-day seminar was chaired by Mr Nols, a director at Eurostat responsible for the management of CRONOS, and organized by Mr C. Dewaleyne, manager of the data base, and Mr Callais of CISI. A dozen CISI economists and about 40 officials of the Statistical Office took part. The participants from Eurostat described the main features of the statistics they work on in a series of lectures followed by discussion. Many problems were discussed or mentioned, with particular reference to the correct description of contents, the forms of classification of statistical series, the improvement of updating procedures and the preparation of a descriptive catalogue of series—in short, some of the problems concerning 'producers' and 'distributors' of statistical data.

## The Austrian Central Statistical Office

The Director-General of Eurostat recently visited the Austrian Central Statistical Office in Vienna. Discussions with the President, Dr Josef Schmidl, and his colleagues concentrated on the work of the two Offices on the United Nations International Comparison of Prices Project, an area where there has been close collaboration in the framework of the regional contribution by the Economic Commission of Europe.

Other areas where an exchange of information and ideas showed that there were interesting possibilities for future collaboration were National Accounts, External Trade and Transport Statistics and the development of data bases. The visit included a demonstration of the capabilities of the ISIS Data Bank and ended with the presentation by Mr la Cour of a paper to the Austrian Statistical Society on 'The Statistical System in the European Economic Community'. # Conference of the Directors-General of the National Statistical Institutes

The directors-general of the national statistical institutes met in Brussels on 19 and 20 November, with Mr Dornonville de la Cour in the chair, to examine the current state of Eurostat work. Among other things, the participants discussed problems to do with the on-line dissemination of data bank material and were informed of the agreements reached between Eurostat and the OECD on the coordinated dissemination of purchasing power parity statistics.

The directors-general expressed their appreciation of the work of Mr Helmut Schumacher, who had been Director of Agricultural and Energy Statistics until his departure from Eurostat after twenty-three years' service. Mr Darragon, Head of the Energy Division, had taken over his duties ad interim in Directorate D.

# Rolf Wagenführ, first Director-General of SOEC

A commemorative work

We are happy to inform our readers that a book has just come off the press in Germany which may interest users of European statistics and officials of Eurostat. The publication takes the form of a collection of articles and was conceived by Günter Menges and Reiner Zwer. It is devoted to the memory of Rolf Wagenführ who was for many years Director-General of Eurostat. The title is 'Probleme internationaler wirtschafts- und sozialstatistischer Vergleiche', Bund-Verlag, Köln, 1981.

A few words on the life of Rolf Wagenführ are appropriate. Born in 1905, he was appointed first head of the Statistics division with the ECSC High Authority and later became the first Director-General of the Statistical Office of the European Communities. In 1966, at the age of 61 he left the Office to devote himself entirely to science. Since 1957 he had been Professor of economic and social statistics at the University of Heidelberg where he created the Institute for international comparative studies in economic and social statistics. He died in 1975 after a life well spent, active until the end, rich in plans and very influential.

The work contains general articles by some of the many personalities who knew M. Wagenführ. Amonst these, Dr. Helmut Schumacher recalls his experience as assistant at the Statistical Office of the European Communities.

#### General information

The publications of the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat) are grouped according to 'themes', of which the reader will find a list below.

Eurostat News provides the public with a regular flow of information on the progress of the SOEC publications programme. The presentation is such that it is clear which publications have just appeared in the course of the last quarter and which are in course of preparation and will thus be available in the near future. There follows a list of 'periodicals', indicating their frequency of publication (monthly, quarterly, half-yearly).

The information provided on each publication is as follows: 'theme' to which the work belongs, title of volume, international classification number (ISBN or ISSN), languages in which available, format, number of pages, price and brief summary of content. For practical reasons, the price is given in only one currency, the BFR (Belgian franc) which is the legal tender in the country of publication (the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg). The price thus indicated applies when orders are placed directly with the Office for Official Publications of the European Communities (L-2985 Luxembourg, 5 rue du Commerce – postal cheque account (CCP) 19 190-81 - bank current account BIL 8-109/6003/300) and serves as a rough guide to the prices in the various national currencies in the event of purchase from the sales offices which are listed on the third page of the cover. The languages in which the publications are available are shown by the following abbreviations: M multilingual, i.e. in the official languages of the European Communities.

DA = Danish, DE = German, EN = English, GR = Greek, FR = French, IT = Italian, NL = Dutch
