STOA Workplan 1999 Adopted

This week in Strasbourg, during its meeting of Tuesday 12 January, the Bureau of the European Parliament approved the STOA Workplan 1999 which had been adopted by the STOA Panel at its meeting of 17 December. A summary listing the twelve projects can be found further in this issue.

New study to examine the options for the future global satellite positioning system

The first project steering group of a 1999 study was conducted on the 13 January in Strasbourg on a Global Navigation System by Satellite (GNSS 2), requested by the Committee on Transport and Tourism. Three MEPs - Mrs LANGENHAGEN, Mr HOPPENSTEDT and Mr WIJSENBEEK - attended. This is a key subject, as the future system, to replace the present US-owned GPS service, will have an enormous economic potential. There is concern about how European industry, in accord with the EU institutions and the European Space Agency, should harness this potential.




