STOA Workplan 2000

Of the 18 projects adopted for 2000, Project Steering Group meetings have been held already for 12 and 9 calls for tender sent out. As a result, despite this year's late start, we are on course for getting all projects underway before the summer break

This month Mr. TRAKATELLIS will send a letter to each Committee asking them already to prepare ideas for the 2001 Workplan. It is hoped to finalise this before the end of 2000 so that we can start immediately in January 2001 to prepare project briefs and calls for tender. In this way, it is hoped that some studies could be completed before the summer or at the latest in September, rather than at the end of the year.

Presentation on silicone gel breast implants

Dr. MARTÍN-MORENO and Ms. WISBAUM of the Spanish National School of Health in Madrid, gave a presentation of the STOA study "Health risks posed by silicone implants in general, with a special reference to breast implants" at a meeting of the Committee on Petitions on Tuesday 23rd May. Members of other Committees were also invited, as were representatives from the Commission and other organizations, lobbies and members of the public. The presentation was very well received and the methodology used in the study allowed various groups with an interest (and indeed sufferers from problems linked to silicone implants) to express their views and have their points of view taken into account. The Commission, which 4 months previously had stated that it saw no need for specific action on this matter, was persuaded by evidence, including that collected during the study, to change its view and to call for monitoring of the use of implants and information and warnings to be given to patients. The Commission stated its intention at the meeting to bring out a proposal on this matter before the end of the year. Soon after this presentation, and coincidentally, research in the UK showed that one of the alternatives to silicone, soybean oil (Trilucent implants) could leak and break down to form carcinogens. Patients in the UK with such implants were urged to have them removed. STOA is honoured to have been involved in casting some light on this very controversial issue.

Format of studies

Many Members have asked that STOA studies be presented in a more user-friendly way and be made easier to read. As a first step, all studies now contain an "Options Brief", of about 2 pages, translated into all official languages. The slightly longer Executive Summary (5 pages), will be made available in English, French and German. In future, STOA will look at other ways in which our studies can be made more easily readable.
