Fast start to 1999 projects ahead of European Parliament Elections

With the European Parliament Elections coming in the middle of 1999, STOA has made an earlier start on execution of the annual Workplan than ever before. It aims to deliver Interim Studies for all projects before Parliament dissolves. The Final Studies will be ready at the latest by the time the new Parliament starts work. This rapid start-up has been facilitated by the early decisions on the approval of the 1999 Workplan taken by the STOA Panel in December and the Bureau of the European Parliament in January.

As a result, half the calls for tenders will already have been launched by mid-February.

Latest studies delivered by STOA include 'Coal-mining technology', 'Orphan drugs' and 'Renewable energy sources for the developing world'

The STOA Panel will receive several Draft Final Studies at its meeting of 11 February in Strasbourg resulting from 1998 projects: 'Coal-mining technology' for the Committee on Research, Technological Development and Energy; 'SMEs, technology and development' and 'Renewable energy sources in the developing world', for the Committee on Development and Cooperation; and 'Orphan Drugs' for the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Consumer Protection. In addition, the following Interim Studies will also be distributed: 'Bioinformatics', 'Revitalising Railways', 'Cultural diversity', 'Juridical network' and 'Discards in fisheries'.


