NEWS

	The mandate of STOA was confirmed by the Bureau of the European Parliament on Monday, 17 February 1997 when it adopted the report by Mr Antoni GUTIERREZ DIAZ, Vice-President, on STOA's role in the European Parliament.
	The STOA Workplan 1997 was adopted at an extraordinary Panel meeting in Brussels on 8 January 1997. The part-session week of January 1997 was dedicated to the reconstitution of Committees and Delegations. It was therefore decided not to hold a STOA Panel meeting that week. For this reason, there was no issue of the STOA Newsletter in January.
,	All (new) Committee Chairmen were asked to (re)nominate their Members and Substitute Members on the STOA Panel. The constituent meeting will take place at the meeting of 20 February in Strasbourg. The election of the Bureau is foreseen for the meeting of 13 March (cf. page 6 - list of Panel being completed).
	STOA celebrates its 10th anniversary in March 1997. More details in next month's Newsletter.
.	On Monday, 16 December 1996, under the auspices of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe, a Conference on 'Technological assessment, research evaluation and foresight studies' took place in Strasbourg. There were presentations derived from the work of 8 leading research organisations in this field from around Europe, including BETA, of the Université Louis Pasteur, Strasbourg. Mr POMPIDOU and Mr HOLDSWORTH were among the speakers. Mr LAKE of the Research Committee secretariat took part in the round-table discussion.
	A presentation of the 1996 project on 'Technological innovation and money' will be made to the Subcommittee on Monetary Affairs at its meeting in Brussels on Tuesday, 25 February in the morning (room LEO 7C50), by the STOA contractor, Prof. Jaume VALLS PASOLA of the University of Girona, Spain.
	A presentation on the project on Fertility Awareness and Contraception' (Workplan 1995) foreseen for the meeting on 24-25 February of the Committee on Women's Rights has been postponed to the meeting on 19-20 March.
	A Public Hearing was held by the Committee on Research, Technological Development and Energy (Rapporteur: Plooij-Van Gorsel) on 'Development and application of new information technologies in the next decade' of 6 February in Brussels, for which STOA provided background information (project 96/ALP2(i)).
