NEWS

STOA Panel decides on more projects for Workplan 2000 at second discussion round The 2000 Draft Annual Workplan was discussed a second time by the STOA at its meeting in Strasbourg on 17 February 2000 and a further 7 of the proposed projects (see page 8) were adopted. The total of 15 projects have now been approved by the Bureau of the European Parliament at its meeting of 1 March 2000. The few remaining project proposals are due to be discussed at the Panel meeting on 16 March 2000 in Strasbourg.
EPTA Network cooperation (European Parliamentary Technology Assessment) Dr Rolf MEYER of TAB, the German partner of STOA in the EPTA Network was welcomed at the 16 March STOA Panel meeting. Dr MEYER is a member of the team of external advisers helping STOA on quality management. Dick HOLDSWORTH attended the EPTA Directors' meeting, hosted by TAB, on 3 March in Berlin on behalf of STOA. This meeting was in preparation of the EPTA Annual Conference which will take place in September at the Reichstag in Berlin and which will probably focus on a medical theme.
Presentation of STOA project on electronic surveillance at Hearing of the Committee on Citizens' Freedoms in Brussels 'The EU and data protection' was the theme of the Hearing of 22-23 February 2000 at which Duncan CAMPBELL gave a presentation on his part of the 1998 STOA study on 'Development of surveillance technology and risk of abuse of economic information'.
Changes in the composition of the STOA Team Mr Graham CHAMBERS, previously the official responsible for Public Health and Consumer Protection research in the Directorate-General for Research, is taking over from Mr Dick HOLDSWORTH from the beginning of April 2000. Meanwhile, Mr Theo KARAPIPERIS has taken over the management of the STOA office in Brussels. Also new in the Team is Mrs Cristina HELLARA, a national expert from the University of Oviedo, Spain.
Date of future STOA Panel meetings At its meeting on 17 February the STOA Panel decided, for the time being, to continue holding the STOA Panel meetings as before on the Thursdays at 14.30 of the part-session weeks in Strasbourg. Additional meetings could be organised in Brussels.
