STOA Members visit JRC in Ispra

On 5 May Prof. TRAKATELLIS, Chairman of the STOA Panel, accompanied by Mrs LANGENHAGEN, Mr RÜBIG, Mr SPERONI and Mr CHAMBERS and Mrs HELLARA of the STOA secretariat were welcomed at the JRC in Ispra by Mr ALLGEIER, Director-General of the European Commission's Joint Research Centre.

A delegation from the European Parliament visits the Joint Research Centre

A delegation of Members of the European Parliament visited the Joint Research Centre at Ispra today, on the invitation of Herbert Allgeier, the Director-General.

The delegation, comprising members of the STOA (Science and Technology Options Assessment) Panel was headed by Professor A. Trakatellis, Chairman of the STOA Panel and included Mrs. Langenhagen, Mr. Rübig and Mr. Speroni.

The delegation saw developing aspects of the JRC's support of EU legislation in health and consumer protection, assessment of chemical hazards, environment, and EU-wide information exchange.

Members noted the role of the JRC in defining and monitoring the standards set by Parliament and Council legislation and in creating methodologies for the detection and prevention of fraud particularly in agriculture, health, environment and consumer protection.

Especially interesting in the light of BSE and various food scandals were methods for detecting the presence of animal protein in animal feed for herbivores and the presence of genetically modified organisms in basic foodstuffs.

The delegation emphasised the changing but indispensable role of the JRC in working for the European Union as a whole.

It advocated increased co-operation on technical and scientific matters of mutual concern to Parliament and the Commission and noted the importance of the JRC to the region and to the many networking research centres, in both the EU and the candidate countries.

Both parties expressed satisfaction with the visit and exchange of views and look forward to further cooperation between the JRC and the European Parliament.


