ELECTRONIC DOCUMENT DELIVERY

1. A study of the relationship between user needs and technology options

THE STUDY OBJECTIVES WERE:

To specify user needs and assess how closely the various technology options for electronic document delivery currently or soon to be available are likely to match those needs, including financial requirements.

To assess the ability and willingness of publishers to operate a document delivery service.

THE STUDY METHODOLOGY included:

postal questionnaires
personal interviews
a technology review and assessment
development of scenarios
costing of typical systems
literature searches

THE STUDY REPORT gives:

- an analysis of questionnaires completed by librarians, information officers, information scientists and users of library and information services
- transcripts of interviews with users and representatives of user organisations
- an analysis of questionnaires completed by publishers
- transcripts of interviews with publishers
- a review of developments in data capture (text and images), phototypesetting and composition, storage, media, systems, transmission and output devices
- scenarios based on Teletex, facsimile transmission, a hybrid of Teletex and facsimile transmission, satellite transmission, digital optical disc and magnetic tapes
- capital costs, running costs and user costs for typical systems

- a conceptual framework for a document delivery service
- bibliographies on factors relating to the market for a document delivery service and electronic mail

THE STUDY CONCLUDES that:

- there are a number of scenarios for an electronic document delivery service which represent a reasonable, though no complete, match with user's and publisher's requirements, if technical criteria alone are used
- an electronic document delivery service based on current technology could be offered at a price which would appear reasonable to potential users
- publishers in the scientific, technical, medical and professional fields are willing to set up and operate a document delivery service if this is economically viable.

WHO COMMISSIONED THE STUDY?

The study was commissioned jointly by the Publishers Association of the United Kingdom and DG XIII, the Directorate-General Information Market and Innovation, Commission of the European Communities.

The work was undertaken by Pira, the UK research association for the paper & board printing and packaging industries, and the report is published by IEPRC, the International Electronic Publishing Research Centre.

WHO SHOULD READ THE REPORT?

The study is essential reading for policy makers, those with responsibility for strategy and future profit generation in publishing, information managers and equipment suppliers to the information industry. The study provides unique information on:

- information user attitudes
- document delivery technology

- the role of communications technology
- cost comparisons
- systems conceptualisation.

An individual company wishing to undertake such research would require to invest a minimum of £ 50.000 in research resources. The study, complete with full documentation, is offered at a price equal to less than 1% of such costs. The report is in the following parts:

- Literature search
- User survey
- User interviews
- Publishers survey
- Technical mechanisms for document delivery
- The relationship between user needs and technology options for a document delivery service
- Economic feasibility
- Framework for a document delivery service and includes a Management Summary and an Appendix of Select Bibliographies.

ELECTRONIC DOCUMENT DELIVERY — I **The ARTEMIS concept for document digitalisation and teletransmission**

This report prepared by Arthur D. LITTLE, describes a document delivery service, code name ARTEMIS, which prints out on reader's terminals the pages of scientific and technical documents requested from computer data bases. Source documents are 'digitalised', that is, converted to computer readable form, either as text or as facsimile. The former can be printed on a teleprinter, but does not preserve all the format of the original; the latter can be delivered to a facsimile receiver. The digitalised documents are stored in data bases attached to host computers. From these, they can be retrieved in response to a user's request and sent overnight via Euronet or another telecommunications network, to the user's unattended terminal or to his computer for later printing.

Over half of the report is devoted to a detailed and eminently readable description of the technology including a listing of equipment on the market. The technologies affecting electronic document capture and storage, printing terminals and copiers as well as the telecommunications options available are examined and analysed for the non-expert.

As it is well known the usefulness of a catalogue depends very much on it being timely updated. A catalogue is therefore ideally suited for videotex implementation. However, given the high costs, not all 283 pages of the catalogue have been put on Videotex, rather a pilot experiment has been started in which only updates and additions will be displayed on the videotex services of the Commission.

What the videotex and catalogue user should do is checking regularly whether new updates or additions are displayed on videotex and make a note of them in part 4 of the catalogue.
