Opportunities for European Community support for research and development

1. Objectives

The Commission of the European Communities is launching the experimental phase of a stimulation action designed to improve the efficacy of European Research and Development.

The two year experimental phase of this action is intended to test the various methods by which it is to be carried out and which will need to be innovative by comparison with the range of community approaches which have been used for several years in Community scientific and technical programmes.

2. Areas of activity

The primary intention is to support activities

- for which the bringing together of research teams is beneficial or indispensable, either on a monodisciplinary or interdisciplinary basis.
- which would encourage the promotion of high quality teams which do not yet benefit from the support which would seem to be justified by their own worth and the potential value of their work, because of its novel nature.
- which would lead to a strengthening of the communication and dissemination of information within the scientific and technical system.

Seven areas of activity have been selected initially for the experimental phase:

- Pharmacobiology
- Solid state physics
- Optics
- Combustion
- Photometry/photoacoustics
- Interface phenomena
- Climatology
- If proposals are put forward which seem even more appropriate from the point of view of their exem-

plary qualities, or which have even greater potential scientific or technical value the Commission may take them into account.

3. Methods to be tested

- Research grants
- Increasing mobility of researchers
- Twinning of laboratories in different countries
- Developing multidisciplinary, multinational projects

4. Opportunities for Community financial support

The Commission would welcome proposals for research projects meeting the criteria given in sections 2 and 3 and setting out the costs envisaged. These proposals will be assessed by a "peer review" system, overseen by the Committee for the European Development of Science and Technology (CODEST) whose responsibility it will be to make recommendations to the Commission. The level of Commission support will vary depending on the intervention method, and the number of proposals selected in each area.

5. Procedure

The book gives an excellent overview of the productivity problem and some suggestions on ways and means to approach it. An analysis is given of the fundamental mechanisms of light trapping and CO₂ absorption in the plant's leaf and as a result the basic limitations of productivity in a plant. Water, temperature, nutrient and other stresses for the plant's development are reviewed and the limits to productivity analysed in detail. The book ends with recommendations for future work on how to improve the plant's productivity by means of a comprehensive breeding programme.

7. Environmental Impact of Future Coal Production and Use in the EEC

The purpose of this study is:

- to assess according to energy consuming sectors the expected increased level of coal consumptions in the EEC over the 1980-2000 period;
- to estimate to what extent this demand is likely to be met by indigenous coal production;
- to determine the level of polluting emissions and other physical environmental impacts that are likely to be associated with these levels of changed coal production and consumption on a local, regional, national and global basis according to the appropriate context of their evaluation;
- where existing or developing coal use and conversion technologies offer alternative means of utilising coal, to compare the impacts of coal use via these technologies with more traditional and/or direct consumption methods.
