Fifth Annual Symposium in Luxembourg on Financing Industrial Innovation: 'Improving venture capital opportunities in Europe'

On 3-5 October 1984, the fifth of a series of annual symposia on different aspects of financing industrial innovation was held, organized by the Commission of the European Communities, this time together with the European Venture Capital Association (EVCA). As indicated in the title, 'Improving venture capital opportunities in Europe', the emphasis was on potential opportunities within the European Community for the venture capital (VC) approach to financing new technology-based firms (NTBFs), and on how to overcome some of the relevant problems. It concentrated on three main areas: transborder investment within the EC, problems and opportunities in information-technology-based business, and how aspiring entrepreneurs, venture managers and venture capitalists can be selected and nurtured.

The symposium was attended by about 200 participants, and began with an encouraging opening speech by Mr. Santer, President of the Luxembourg Government, and reviews of progress by the Commission's services and by the EVCA. In the plenary sessions, a recurring theme was the need for NTBFs to be oriented to European or world markets in order to achieve economic viability; this is especially true in the information-technology-based sector, where the complex industrial property rights situation was explained, and where the Community's ESPRIT research programme should produce exploitable spin-offs in coming years. NTBFs should be able to expect help in operating across national borders from their VC backers, and some of the practical problems of syndicated transnational financing were clearly described. In transnational operations, those industrial corporations which have set up VC subsidiaries might be expected to have advantages, but illustrations were given of some inherent difficulties.

In selecting and training managers of NTBFs and venture capitalists, it became clear that there were no golden rules, and no short cuts to overcome lack of practical experience. Like entrepreneurs, such individ-

duals come from a variety of backgrounds, and success depended more upon personal qualities than specific formal qualifications. The experience was described of using incentive stock options in the US as a powerful motivational instrument to attract suitable managers to NTBFs, and developments in the fiscal and legal constraints on their use within different Community Member States were reviewed, based on a study recently completed. For part of the symposium, participants split into six parallel working groups to consider some of the topics addressed during plenary working sessions, and their results and recommendations were presented in the final plenary session, and discussed by a panel. Innovation from Community Research

Pyrolysing furnace recuperating energy from fatty domestic waste

Used fats from the catering trade may, instead of being thrown away after use — thus adding to the volume of domestic refuse — be collected separately and processed prior to conversion into animal feed.

Until recently this process encountered two problems. First, the process required a significant quantity of primary energy, and secondly, the problem remained of disposing of impurities and non-recyclable fatty substances.

The new process uses pyrolysis to dispose of the impurities and nonrecyclable fatty substances without creating any pollution; at the same time, recuperation of the heat of combustion leads to a reduction of some 15% in primary energy requirements. This environmentally suitable furnace was developed by SAF, a firm specializing in the recycling of fats, in a research programme jointly financed by the Commission of the European Communities.

Cooperation between Technological Fairs

One of the most serious problems of small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) is their small scale managerial staff. Indeed the business of running a SME is often a one-man show. In such a situation the head of a SME has neither time nor money 'to waste' in travel abroad to visit foreign fairs and exhibitions where he could find offers of new products and services or ideas useful to his firm. In most cases he will be able to visit regional or at most national events.

One possible solution to this problem is to 'europeanize' national events by stimulating the participation of foreign exhibitors.

In the framework of the **Plan for the transnational development for the supporting infrastructure for innovation and technology transfer** ('), the Commission of the European Communities by encouraging foreign exhibitors to take part in national events (technology exchange fairs, exhibitions, etc.) aims at promoting the creation of an efficient common market for the licensing of technologies.

The support of the Commission could take the form of a financial grant to cover the extra cost involved in giving a transnational dimension to national events.

In order to devise a European strategy (lay down eligibility criteria, avoid duplication of effort, etc.) the Commission of the European Communities has decided to hold a seminar in Luxembourg on 29 and 30 April 1985.

Coopération entre foires technologiques

La gestion des PMEs par un groupe de personnes très restreint, voire réduit à un seul chef d'entreprise, pose des problèmes sérieux lorsqu'il s'agit de visiter des foires ou expositions étrangères pour y rechercher des produits nouveaux ou des idées utiles au développement de l'entreprise.

Dans ces conditions, le chef d'entreprise aura la tendance à ne «gaspiller» ni temps, ni argent pour de telles visites et se limitera à des manifestations organisées sur un plan régional ou tout au plus national.

Une façon de résoudre ce problème pourrait consister à donner un caractère plus européen aux foires tech-

nologiques nationales en encourageant la participation d'opérateurs étrangers.

Dans le cadre du **Plan de développement transnational de l'infrastructure d'assistance à l'innovation et au transfert des technologies** (¹), la Commission des Communautés européennes, en encourageant la participation d'opérateurs étrangers à des foires technologiques nationales, vise à la création d'un marché commun efficace des licences dans le domaine de la technologie.

La contribution de la Commission pourrait avoir la forme d'une subvention destinée à couvrir les frais supplémentaires nécessaires à donner une dimension transnationale à des manifestations nationales.

Dans le but de dégager les lignes d'une stratégie européenne (critères de sélection, doubles emplois à éviter, etc.), la Commission des Communautés européennes a décidé d'organiser un séminaire à Luxembourg les 29 et 30 avril 1985.

Kooperation zwischen Technologie-Messen

Wenn kleine und mittlere Unternehmungen, deren Unternehmensführung meist nur aus einigen wenigen Personen, zuweilen sogar nur aus einem Geschäftsführer besteht, Messen bzw. Ausstellungen im Ausland besuchen wollen, um dort neue Produkte, Dienstleistungen oder nützliche Ideen zur Entwicklung des eigenen Unternehmens kennenzulernen, dann wirft dies oft ernsthafte Probleme auf. Vielfach wird sich der Leiter einer solchen Unternehmung darauf beschränken müssen, regionale oder bestenfalls nationale Veranstaltungen dieser Art zu besuchen.

Eine Lösung dieses Problems könnte darin liegen, die nationalen Veranstaltungen zu „europäisieren“ und dazu die Beteiligung ausländischer Aussteller anzuregen.

Im Rahmen des **Planes für die transnationale Entwicklung der Infrastruktur zur Unterstützung von Innovation und Technologietransfer** (¹) beabsichtigt die Kommission der Europäischen Gemeinschaften, durch Förderung der Beteiligung ausländischer Aussteller an nationalen Veranstaltungen (Technologie-Messen, Ausstellungen usw.) einen effizienten gemeinsamen Markt für Lizenzen im Technologiebereich zu schaffen.

Der Beitrag der Kommission könnte in der Gewährung einer Subvention zur Deckung der Kosten bestehen, die dadurch entstehen, daß nationale Veranstaltungen eine transnationale Dimension erhalten.

Im Hinblick auf die Festlegung einer europäischen Strategie (Auswahlkriterien, Vermeidung von Doppelarbeit usw.) hat die Kommission der Europäischen Ge-

meinschaften beschlossen, am 29. und 30. April 1985 in Luxemburg ein Seminar abzuhalten.

Nel quadro del **Piano per lo sviluppo transnazionale delle infrastrutture di supporto all'innovazione ed al trasferimento di tecnologie** (¹), la Commissione delle Comunità europee, incoraggiando operatori stranieri a partecipare a delle fiere tecnologiche nazionali, mira a promuovere la creazione di un mercato comune efficiente per le licenze di tecnologia.

Il contributo della Commissione potrebbe prendere la forma di una sovvenzione destinata a coprire i costi straordinari necessari a dare una dimensione transnazionale a manifestazioni nazionali.

Allo scopo di delineare una strategia europea (formulare delle regole di eleggibilità, evitare duplicazioni, ecc.) la Commissione delle Comunità europee ha deciso di organizzare un seminario in Lussemburgo il 29 e 30 aprile 1985.
