


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EUROPEAN COMMUNITY (EC) TRADE WITH AFRICAN, CARIBBEAN AND PACIFIC COUNTRIES (ACP) -Results until December 1992-

PART I. EC TRADE BALANCE VIS-A-VIS THE ACP AND CLASS 2 COUNTRIES

EC TRADE BALANCE WITH ACP



1. EC's trade deficit with the ACP countries was 976,2 million ecus in 1992, while in 1991 this deficit was nearly 3.263 million ecus. This reduction of the EC's trade deficit is due both to the rise of EC exports (7,0%) and the reduction of EC imports (6,0%) from these countries. The EC cover ratio (exports over imports) with ACP was 94,6 in 1992, while in 1991 was 83,1.

2. The EC experienced a surplus of nearly 279 million ecus during the fourth quarter of 1992.

3. EC's trade balance with CLASS 2 countries experienced a surplus of around 7.095 million ecus in 1992, compared with a deficit of 7.646 million in 1991. While EC exports to this group increased by 7,1%, EC imports went down 3,1%.

4. The cover ratio for CLASS 2 countries was 105 in 1992, while in 1991 was 95.

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
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PART II. EC IMPORTS FROM THE ACP AND CLASS 2 COUNTRIES

EC IMPORTS FROM ACP



1. EC imports from ACP went down 6% in value to 18,1 billion ecus in 1992, compared to 1991. However in volume these imports increased by 0,9%.

2. EC imports of fuel (SITC 3) decreased by 15% in value and 4,5% in volume between 1992 and 1991. Imports of this product represented 31% of total EC imports from ACP. EC imports of food, beverages and tobacco (SITC 0+1) and raw materials other than fuels went down 1,4% and 8,4% in value respectively. EC imports of manufactured products (SITC 5-8) increased by 6,9% in value and 11,7% in volume in 1992.

3. EC imports from CLASS 2 countries decreased by 3,1% in value between 1991 and 1992; however in volume they increased by 2,6%. EC imports of manufactured products (nearly 50% of total imports from this group) increased by 1,9%, while EC imports of fuel (27% of total) decreased by nearly 13%.



PART III. EC EXPORTS TO THE ACP AND CLASS 2 COUNTRIES

EC EXPORTS TO ACP



1. EC exports to ACP went up 7,0% in value and 4,4% in volume to 17,1 billion ecus in 1992. EC exports to CLASS 2 countries increased by 7,1% in value and 5,6% in volume in the same year.

2. EC exports of manufactured products to ACP (80% of total EC exports to this group) went up 7,8% to 13,6 billion ecus in 1992 (4,7% in volume), while EC exports of these products to CLASS 2 countries increased by 8,7% between 1991 and 1992.

3. EC exports of food, beverages and tobacco to the ACP increased by 6,5% in 1992, while EC exports of raw materials other than fuels increased by 12,1% between 1991 and 1992.

PART IV. EC-ACP TRADE BY PARTNER COUNTRIES

The most significant fact in the EC-ACP trade by groups of countries in 1992 was the EC surplus experienced with West Africa (231 million ecus), mainly due to the reduction of the EC trade deficit with Nigeria (from 1.637 million ecus in 1991 to 604 in 1992) and Ivory Coast (from 749 to 587 million ecus), and the increase of the EC surplus with Liberia (from 221 to 439 million ecus). In 1991 EC trade deficit with this group of countries was

around 1.550 million ecus. EC trade deficit with Central Africa went down from around 1.860 million ecus in 1991 to 1.480 million ecus in 1992. Another significant fact was the important surplus experienced by the EC with Central and South America, in the fourth quarter of 1992, mainly due to the evolution of the trade flows with Bahamas. However, EC trade deficit with this group increased from 19 million ecus in 1991 to 80 million ecus in 1992.

EC TRADE BALANCE WITH ACP BY PARTNERS




PART V. EC-ACP TRADE BY MAIN PRODUCTS

1. EC imports of crude petroleum from ACP (30,8% of the total EC imports from these countries) went down 15,1% to 5,5 billion ecus in 1992. More than 11% of total EC imports of crude petroleum came from the ACP countries. Nigeria, Angola and Gabon were the most important ACP exporting countries of this product to the EC.

2. EC imports of non industrial diamonds have increased by 33% between 1991 and 1992, while EC imports of diamonds unsorted went down by 30%. The most important ACP partners of the EC were Congo, Liberia and Zaire.

3. EC imports of raw cane sugar and fresh bananas increased by 4,6% and 3,7% respectively, while imports of coffee went down by 19,2% to 0,7 billion ecus in 1992 (however they increased by 0,3% in volume).

4. 98% of the EC imports of tropical wood, 81% of raw cane sugar and nearly 81% of cocoa beans came from the ACP countries in 1992. On the other hand, only 2,5% of total EC imports of crude petroleum and 6,3% of non agglomerated iron ores came from these countries.

5. The EC imports from ACP which decreased most in 1992 were those of bars of refined copper (79%), gold unwrought (46,2%), diamonds unsorted (30%) and non agglomerated iron ores (26,7%).

6. The degree of concentration of EC imports from ACP remained rather stable in 1992 when compared to 1991: five products were required to cover nearly 50% of total EC imports from this group of countries: crude petroleum, non industrial diamonds, cocoa beans, raw cane sugar and coffee.


