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Pig population in August 1994


Gross own-production forecast

The following pages contain the results of the pig survey carried out in the Member States in August, together with forecasts for gross own-production up to and including June 1995. In accordance with Commission Decision No 94/432/EC of 30 May 1994, Greece, Luxembourg and Portugal were exempt from the August survey. Eurostat has estimated the populations in those countries in the light of developments in the other Member States.

Pig population in the EC down on previous year

In August this year, there were 110.594 million pigs in the Community. This corresponds to a reduction of 2.516 million or -2.2% over the population in the previous year (113.110 million).

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The pig population fell particularly sharply in Belgium (-5.2% or 374 000 animals) and Germany (-5.3% or 1.409 million animals), particularly as a result of the high incidence of swine fever. In Germany, an additional factor was the continuing reduction of the population in the new Federal Länder. However, the pig population was substantially down on the previous year in Denmark too (-3.2% or 362 000 animals). This would appear to reflect a trend towards more modest growth in production. The figures also dropped in Italy (-1.1% or -118 000 animals), Spain (-0.9% or -174 000 animals) and the United Kingdom (-0.8% or -65 000 animals). The figures were up by +0.1% and +0.2% respectively over the previous year in France and the Netherlands, however. The only country with an appreciable increase was Ireland, with +1.5%.

Reductions in virtually all categories

The reductions were in practically all the categories, but the number of breeding sows fell particularly sharply (-3.3% or 393 000 animals). The main contributor to this development was Germany, where the population of breeding sows alone fell by -8.0% or 233 000 animals. However, the reduction was also above average in both Germany and the United Kingdom with -6.5% and -5.3% respectively. In Spain, the breeding-sow population dropped by -3.1%, in Ireland by -2.3% and in France by -1.3%. The only country in which this category increased was the Netherlands (+4.7%). In Italy the population was only slightly over the level for the previous year (+0.6%). The number of covered sows, which is a decisive factor for the future development of the population, was -3.0% or -244 000 animals down over the previous year. The number of the sows covered for the first time even fell by -6.6%. Piglet populations were also substantially down (-2.7% or 857 000 animals). The number of animals in the 20kg-50kg category fell by -2.4% or 657 000 and fattening pigs weighing between 50kg and 60kg fell by -2.5% or 572 000 animals. The only category to maintain and even slightly exceed the level for the previous year (+0.3%) was fattening pigs weighing between 80kg and 110kg.

Continuing reductions in the new Federal Länder

The total reduction of 1.409 million pigs in Germany resulted from a reduction of 990 000 animals (-4.4%) in the old Federal Länder and for 19 000 (-10.4%) in the new Länder. Whereas the sharp reduction in the old Länder was primarily the result of swine fever, the continuing drop in the new Länder indicates that the process of adjustment is not yet completed. There were above-average reductions in the very categories which are particularly important for future production, such as piglets (-15.3%), breeding pigs (-16.4%) and covered breeding sows (-16.1%). The number of sows covered for the first time, which to a certain extent reflects the pigbreeders market expectations, fell by a whole -19.4%. There are now a total of 3.624 million pigs on the territory of the former GDR. This represents a 70% reduction over the 12.013 million in October 1989, i.e. shortly before the Wall came down.



Gross own-production also declining

The drop in the pig population in the Community will not be without its effects on production. According to the Member States' forecasts, gross own-production (for the Community as a whole for the period July 1994 to June 1995) will be 178.204 million pigs. This represents a -1.3% (2.377 million) reduction over the previous year. The expected drop in production is divided over the various quarters as follows: from July to September gross own-production was 43.574 million pigs, corresponding to a drop of -1.4% (601 000) over the same period in the previous year. In the fourth quarter of 1994, production should increase to 47 696 million. In the first quarter of 1995, gross own-production is expected to fall to 44.688 million (-1.4% over the previous year) and in the second quarter to 42.245 million (-1.1% over the previous year). The situation varies widely from one Member State to another, however. The sharpest reductions are in Belgium with -5.4%, followed by Portugal (-5.2%), Greece (-3.5%) and Germany (-3.0%). The fall in gross own-production in Spain is expected to be -1.7%, while France and the United Kingdom are expecting a reduction of around -0.8% and Denmark of around -0.4%. All the other Member States expect their production to increase. First place is taken by Ireland with +3.3% followed by Italy with +2.6%. Luxembourg is expecting an increase of 1.5% and the Netherlands of 0.7%.

The end of the crisis?

From April 1994 onwards, pig meat prices started to rise quite steadily. They passed the 100 ECU/100kg threshold in mid-April and since then have continued to rise, reaching a peak of ECU 118.26 at the end of May 1994. In the following months, prices settled at a level of about ECU 108/110.

This price recovery early in the summer had been forecast following the census of December 1993 and was confirmed by the survey carried out in April 1994. The decrease in breeding livestock had made it possible to predict an improvement in prices during the last six months of 1994.

From a veterinary point of view, the situation in Germany and Belgium improved over the summer once the swine fever had cleared up. Exceptional market support measures introduced as a result of this illness definitely gave a boost to prices, as around 1.2 million animals were not put on the market. Unfortunately, however, the veterinary situation is still unstable, as new outbreaks of swine fever have been detected once again in Belgium and Germany. Several other outbreaks of African swine fever have occurred in Spain.

There is still a trade surplus in the Community but the increase in production seems to have stopped. The reduction of livestock and gross home production in the coming months give reason to hope for a more favourable economic outlook in the months ahead.
