## 1981 CENSUS OF POPULATION

First results for Italy

A census of population was carried out in Italy on 25 October 1981 and a preliminary report of the census was issued in March 1982. Although the census was held within the context of the Community directive for synchronised censuses in 1981 it was not possible, for administrative reasons, to carry out the enumeration in the Spring of 1981 as specified in the directive, and a derogation was obtained permitting a postponement until the Autumn.

The resident population at 25 October 1981, comprising all persons whose normal residence was in Italy, amounted to 56 244 000 persons, an increase of 2 107 000 or 3.9% on the census of 24 October 1971. This increase was somewhat less than that recorded for preceding inter-censal periods. Between the 1961 and 1971 censuses, the total resident population rose by 6.9% and between the 1951 and 1961 censuses by 6.5%.

Table 1 shows the distribution of the population by broad geographical areas as well as changes since earlier censuses.

Northern Italy, which showed the greatest increase in percentage terms (+ 10.2%) during the period 1961-1971 showed the least increase (+ 2.6%) between 1971 and 1981. In contrast the percentage increase in population was greatest between 1971 and 1981 in Southern Italy and the islands (+ 5.3%) whereas it had been least in the earlier period (+ 1.6%). These changing trends are due in large part to a slowing down of the migration flow from the south to the north.

Table 2 gives the 1971 and 1981 resident population figures for the twenty Regions of Italy. Also shown is the present population for each region. The latter concept refers to all persons present in the region at census date regardless of their normal place of residence. For Italy as a whole, the present population exceeded the resident population by some 92,000 persons in 1981.
