## ENRIQUE BARON CRESPO ELECTED EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT PRESIDENT


Enrique Baron Crespo became President of the newly elected European Parliament when it held its first meeting in Strasbourg July 25.

A Spanish socialist, Baron was given a clear mandate by 301 of the 518 parliamentarians, making him the first President elected in a single ballot. Baron is also the first Spaniard to head a European Community institution and the only other socialist President of the Parliament since Pieter Dankert (January 1982 to July 1984). He succeeds Sir Henry Plumb, the British conservative President of the Parliament since January 1987.

In his acceptance speech, Baron said that the European Community should encouage the development of parliamentary democracy in countries such as Hungary and the Soviet Union.

Baron has been a member of the European Parliament since 1986 and Vice President of the Parliament since 1987. Before entering European politics, Mr. Baron was a member of the Spanish Parliament (1977-1987), Minister for Transport, Tourism and Communications (1982-1985)), and Spokesman on economic affairs for the socialist parliamentary party (1977-1982).
