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By letter of 10 August 1981, the President of the Council of the European Communities requested the European Parliament, pursuant to Article 43 of the EEC Treaty, to deliver an opinion on the proposal from the Commission of the European Communities to the Council for a regulation concerning the distribution among the Member States of the total catch possibilities available to the Community in 1981 of stocks or groups of stocks occurring in the Community fishing zone.

On 19 August 1981, the President of the European Parliament referred this proposal to the Committee on Agriculture as the committee responsible.

On 21 September 1981, the Committee on Agriculture appointed Miss Joyce Quin rapporteur.

The Committee considered this proposal at its meetings of 26/27 October 1981, 10/11 November 1981 and 16 November 1981.

At the meeting of 16 November 1981 the Committee adopted the motion for a resolution by ten votes with five abstentions.

, The Committee on Agriculture hereby submits to the European Parliament the following motion for a resolution:

#### MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION

embodying the opinion of the European Parliament on the proposal from the Commission of the European Communities to the Council for a regulation concerning the distribution among the Member States of the total catch possibilities available to the Community in 1981 of stocks or groups of stocks occurring in the Community fishing zone

#### The European Parliament,

- having regard to the proposal from the Commission of the European Communities to the Council (COM(81) 435 final),
- having been consulted by the Council pursuant to Article-43 of the EEC Treaty (Doc. 1-436/81),
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Agriculture (Doc.1-763/81 ),
- having regard to the report drawn up by Mr KIRK on the total allowable catches for 1981 (Doc.1-732/81),
- whereas the Council of Ministers has reached a limited agreement on measures to improve the market organization for fish, on a number of agreements with certain third countries and on a limited aid to restructuring the fisheries fleet,
- stressing the importance of essential decisions contained in Parliament's Resolution of 21.11.1980 on the report by Mr Kirk on total allowable catches for 1980 (Doc. 1-597/80),
- Calls upon the Council to demonstrate that it has the political will to achieve an overall policy for the effective management of the Community's fishery resources;
- 2. Considers that such an agreement can only be realized if based above all on effective measures to ensure adequate incomes to fishermen throughout the Community, while taking into account the interests of the processing industry;

Emphasizes that without such adequate measures to ensure reasonable incomes to fishermen, quotas will constitute little more than a political fiction of little significance in face of the economic realities faced by fishermen;

3. Stresses, therefore, the importance of the Commission implementing effectively the measures adopted to improve the market organization, while ensuring that market policy is not disrupted by agreements with third countries granted market access to Community markets in exchange for fishing quotas;

- 4. Emphasizes that the progress achieved by the recent agreement in the Council could be undermined if the Council failed to achieve agreement on arrangements for quotas and access, which have been the most politically divisive questions in past negotiations;
- 5. Believes that these political problems would be minimized if quotas were to result from overall management policies:
- Considers, therefore, that there should be greater reliance on conservation measures, such as mesh size regulation and seasonal zone closure, rather than quota arrangements;
- 7. Points to the serious economic and political problems which were raised by the recent opening of quotas for herring west of Scotland and in the North Sea; refers in particular to the Commission's Statement that past catch figures do not allow a calculation formula to be developed for use as a reference base for a systematic and desirable system of distribution, and requests clarification of this statement, particularly as to its implication for future Commission proposals;
- 8. Considers that in future catch quotas should be allocated with greater reference to fishing methods, facilities for processing on board and outlets on-shore, so as to prevent disruption of the market in this sector. Requests the Commission to examine whether the release of quotas at intervals, taking account of market demand, might not be a way of preventing fish for human consumption from being processed into fish meal.
- 9. Calls for a review of the process by which total allowable catches are determined, and for the European Parliament to be involved fully in this process;
  - 10. Calls for greater clarification from the Commission concerning its system for arriving at TACs and on the balance between scientific factors on the one hand and economic and social factors on the other; requests the Commission to clarify the criteria by which it decides that TAC proposals should differ from the recommendations of ICES;
- 11. Notes that the Commission has placed emphasis on a presentation of the quota distribution between Member States in terms of cod equivalents; Believes that this method of presentation may act to camouflage important changes in the allocation of individual species to Member States; Believes that such changes may not reflect realistically the traditional fishing patterns, consumption requirements and price relationships

of the individual Member States;

Points, as an example, to the fact that the cod allocations to the United Kingdom in the North Sea have been reduced progressively from 48.8%, 46.6%, 45% to the present figure of 41.3%;

Believes, in view of the consumption requirement of the UK, that additional quantities of haddock, whiting and plaice in no way compensate for a reduction in cod allocations;

Points out that for other countries, such as Denmark, the readjustments in allocation of the quota for the major species, without reference to traditional catches, merely acts to shift the economic and social problems from one group of fishermen to another;

Points out furthermore that in fixing quotas account should be taken of recently established fleets fishing for previously underexploited species of fish such as horse mackerel and blue whiting;

- 12. Points out that no calculations have been made of the effect the Commission proposal would have on traditional fishing activities in the Member States; regards it as irresponsible to adopt a proposal whose implications have not been assessed by the Community institutions, and therefore calls on the Commission to calculate the effect of its proposals on traditional and historical fishing activities in the Community and to submit its assessment to the European Parliament;
- Affirms once more the importance of introducing an effective licencing system;
- 4. Believes that the Commission's proposals for distribution of quotas will only be acceptable on condition that:
  - (a) the operation of the market organization is seen in the next months to be implemented effectively;
  - (b) realistic proposals are made for restructuring the Community's fishing fleet, accompanied by social proposals to help adapt the Community's fishing fleet to likely future requirements taking account of what has already been achieved in this area at national level in the various Member States; and
  - (c) special arrangements are made for regions particularly dependent on fishing to ensure their priority access to local waters and to stocks of mainly local interest;

15. Points out that in the Commission's proposal there are a number of zones where very small quota allocations, in some cases 50 tonnes or less, are proposed; requests, therefore, the Commission to supply additional information on the feasibility of keeping within such small quotas and whether the problem of controlling amounts caught will be made more difficult;

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- 16. Requests, in view of the European Parliament's past support for the consideration of a multi-species method of establishing TACs, that Community money for research into this method should be made available;
- 17. Believes that national aids are likely to continue in view of the present income difficulties; calls, therefore, upon the Commission to draw up a realistic framework for their regulation;
- 18. Believes that the European Parliament, in accordance with Article 43 of the EEC Treaty, must be permitted to give its opinion on a revision of the present proposals; and that therefore a proper dialogue between the European Parliament and the Council should be developed in order that no unnecessary delays result.
