FORWORD

The European Initiative for Democracy & Human Rights illustrates the commitment of the European Union to assisting in the global effort to build and reinforce pluralist democratic society, governed by the rule of law, and respecting human rights.

With a view to responding to the needs identified by the peoples themselves, the Initiative operates mainly through non-governmental organisations (NGOs) which have submitted project proposals taking account of the guidelines and procedures established by the European Commission, following the Regulations introduced in 1999, as well as the Commission's Vademecum of July 1998.

The role of NGOs in promoting and defending democracy and human rights has long been recognised and valued in the European Union. The scope and diversity of those NGOs appear clearly in this handbook. The projects address a wide range of issues central to modern conceptions of democracy and civil society: genuinely representative structures in both government and the workplace; access to reliable information; ethical practices not just in government but also among those offering services to the public; the principles of equality of opportunity and non-discrimination against minorities; promoting respect for the human rights of all the various individuals who make up society, and so on.

In addition, the EU works in partnership with several international organisations where these are the best means of achieving our joint aims, and where together we can often be more effective than acting alone.

The European Commission is currently reviewing its strategies and management in human rights and democratisation in its external relations. Our ambition is to be more effective in defining our goals and more efficient in achieving them. The Commission aims be a reliable and solid partner in these joint ventures to improve the lives of large numbers of people, and I am confident that we shall do this.

This handbook demonstrates that there is no shortage of good ideas, and talented people to implement them, in the worthwhile endeavour to make democratic society the cornerstone of lasting stability, peace and prosperity in the world at the dawn of the new millennium.

INTRODUCTION

The 1999 European Initiative for Democracy and Human Rights

This is the first annual volume of the European Initiative for Democracy and Human Rights (EIDHR). The projects presented are currently being implemented and are financed through the 1999 Budget (Budget lines B7-700, 701, 7020, 7021, 7022, 704, 706, 707 and 709) to which was allocated a total of EUR 75.3 million.

Regulations on the development and consolidation of democracy and the rule of law and respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms under Articles 235 and 130W of the EC Treaty came into effect on 11 May 1999⁽¹⁾ and provide a legal basis for all human rights and democratisation activities under Chapter B7-70 of the EU budget by the Council of Ministers of the European Community.

The Human Rights Regulations cover the following areas of activity(2):

- promoting and defending the human rights and fundamental freedoms proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the other international instruments concerning the development and consolidation of democracy and the rule of law, in particular:
 - (a) the promotion and protection of civil and political rights;
 - (b) the promotion and protection of economic, social and cultural rights;
 - (c) the promotion and protection of the human rights of those discriminated against, or suffering from poverty or disadvantage, which will contribute to reduction of poverty and social exclusion;
 - (d) the protection and promotion of the rights of minorities, ethnic groups, indigenous peoples, refugees and displaced persons;
 - (e) supporting local, national, regional or international institutions, including NGOs, involved in the protection, promotion or defence of human rights;
 - (f) support for rehabilitation centres for torture victims and for organisations offering concrete help to victims of human rights abuses or help to improve conditions in places where people are deprived of their liberty in order to prevent torture or ill-treatment;
 - (g) support for education, training and consciousness-raising in the area of human rights;
 - (h) supporting action to monitor human rights, including the training of observers;
 - the promotion of equality of opportunity and non-discriminatory practices, including measures to combat racism and xenophobia;
 - (j) promoting and protecting the fundamental freedoms mentioned in the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, in particular the freedom of opinion, expression and conscience, and the right to use one's own language;

2. supporting the processes of democratisation, in particular:

- (a) promoting and strengthening the rule of law, in particular upholding the independence
 of the judiciary and strengthening it, and support for a humane prison system;
 support for constitutional and legislative reform; support for initiatives in favour of
 the abolition of the death penalty;
- (b) promoting the separation of powers, particularly the independence of the judiciary and the legislature from the executive, and support for institutional reforms;
- (c) promoting pluralism both at political level and at the level of civil society by strengthening the institutions needed to maintain the pluralist nature of that society, including non-governmental organisations (NGOs), and by promoting independent and responsible media and supporting a free press and respect for the rights of freedom of association and assembly;
- (d) promoting good governance, particularly by supporting administrative accountability and the prevention and combating of corruption;
- (e) promoting the participation of the people in the decision-making process at national, regional and local level, in particular by promoting the equal participation of men and women in civil society, in economic life and in politics;
- (f) support for electoral processes, in particular by supporting independent electoral commissions, granting material, technical and legal assistance in preparing for elections, including electoral censuses, taking measures to promote the participation of specific groups, particularly women, in the electoral process, and by training observers;
- (g) supporting national efforts to separate civilian and military functions, training civilian and military personnel and raising their awareness of human rights;

3. support for measures to promote the respect for human rights and democratisation by preventing conflict and dealing with its consequences, in close collaboration with the relevant competent bodies, in particular:

- (a) supporting capacity-building, including the establishment of local early warning systems;
- (b) supporting measures aimed at balancing opportunities and at bridging existing dividing lines among different identity groups;
- supporting measures facilitating the peaceful conciliation of group interests, including support to confidence-building measures relating to human rights and democratisation, in order to prevent conflict and to restore civil peace;
- (d) promoting international humanitarian law and its observance by all parties to a conflict;
- (e) supporting international, regional or local organisations, including the NGOs, involved in preventing, resolving and dealing with the consequences of conflict, including support for establishing ad hoc international criminal tribunals and setting up a permanent international criminal court, together with support and assistance for victims of human rights violations.

Thematic Priorities

Within the areas of activity covered by the Regulations on human rights, the following thematic priorities in the field of human rights, democracy and good governance have been identified for 1999. Applications within these themes were be given priority.

- · Education and awareness-raising of civil society.
- Protection and promotion of the Rights of the Child, including those of child soldiers, on the occasion of the 10th anniversary of the Convention on the Rights of the Child.
- · Innovative actions in the field of conflict prevention and resolution in countries in crisis.
- Promotion of inter-ethnic and inter-racial tolerance in view of the preparation of the World Conference on Racism (2001) and support for indigenous people.
- Good governance measures to promote transparency, accountability and the fight against corruption, notably those which would strengthen co-operation and dialogue between the EU and its partners.

In addition to these priorities which are common to the nine budget lines detailed below, priorities are set within the individual budget lines on the basis of the budget remarks, including projects relating to the consequences of the Kosovo conflict under budget lines B7-700, B7-704, B7-706, and B7-709.



Project Title:

"Future" Education in developing non-violent communication and strengthening tolerance and multicultural co-operation

Summary:

The project is aimed at introducing new pedagogical methods into the educational system of 60 elementary schools in Republika Srpska. It is expected that about 3500 pupils will benefit from this. Activities include giving training courses to teachers on educational methods towards subjects such as non-violent conflict resolution, adapting educational material, organisation of seminars in six municipalities for 120 teachers to introduce them to the material, publication of a handbook. The 120 teachers will implement this project directly with approximately 3500 pupils. After finishing this project these teachers could train other teachers in their municipality (about 500).

Project Title:

Legal Training and Education for the Defence of Roma Rights

Summary:

This project seeks to provide concrete assistance to Roma and other lawyers and fact-finders in the skills necessary to undertake litigation aimed at challenging discriminatory laws and practices. Activities will include: 1) Long-term training by ERRC legal trainers and short-term legal consultants hired to conduct specialized training on particular areas of litigation. Trainers and trainees will aim to a) identify problems susceptible to legal challenge and to fashion systemic legal remedies; b) gather the necessary evidence, including statistical research; c) publicise research results as part of a campaign to shape public attitudes; d) file lawsuits in appropriate jurisdictions. 2) Organisation of yearly workshops for 120 lawyers from four countries on litigation strategies for the defence of Roma rights. Topics will include: 'Strasbourg jurisprudence under Article 14 of the European Convention of Human Rights'; 'ethical issues in legal representation of underprivileged ethnic minority group members', etc. 3) Provision of internships for 12 students of law and/or public administration (preferably Roma) at the ERRC office. 4) Organisation of country specific litigation projects in Bulgaria, Hungary, and two other target countries during which ERRC staff attorneys and visiting experts will assist local attorneys in developing litigation strategies designed to challenge discriminatory laws or practices which affect Roma. 5) Publication of a litigation practice manual for other lawyers in the country.

Asylum support and tolerance building activities in Lithuania

Summary:

This project is aimed at improving legal and social conditions for asylum seekers in Lithuania and raising awareness about refugees. It has 4 different objectives. 1) The Legal Assistance Project provides free legal assistance. It counsels on asylum procedure, prepares cases and assists in appeal procedure. 2) Border Monitoring Project: provides legal counsel to foreigners who wish to obtain refugee status. 3) Social Assistance programme for Refugees and Asylum Seekers includes: humanitarian assistance/activation project for inhabitants at the Refugee Reception Centre in Ruka and Pabrade. About 400 people will benefit from this. Socialisation activities for refugee children staying in Rukla and Pabrade. About 80 people will benefit from this. Facilitating integration of refugees into the Lithuanian society. About 100 people will benefit from this. 4) Public Information / Education Activities aims to raise awareness of Lithuanian Red Cross activities, organise programs in refugee matters and shape positive public opinion. Activities include: seminars on integration, a refugee day for cultural exchange, discussions, press conference and press releases.

Summary:

This project aims to promote tolerance and strengthen cross-border cooperation in the Balkans through increasing participation of women in the decision making process on a local level. Activities include: setting up a steering committee in Sofia, second meeting in Albania, final meeting in FYROM, survey for assessment of women involvement in social/political life in Albania, Bulgaria and FYROM in target regions. The MP network for South Eastern Europe: Implementing the Goals of the Stability Pact

Summary:

This project seeks to promote the goals of the Stability Pact for South Eastern Europe by creating a parliamentary track for its practical implementation: the MP Network for south-eastern Europe. The MP Network will be composed of MPs from the target countries and of selected MEPs, and it will have several aims: A) creation of a forum for open dialogue; B) legislative improvements for key issues related to the target region; C) enhancement of the role of parliaments in sub-regional co-operation; D) providing assistance with the implementation of the Stability Pact; E) accelerate EU integration of south-eastern countries by improving co-operation with the European Parliament. Activities will include: 1) Three conferences, lasting 2-3 days for 35-40 participants each (including 21 MPs from SEE countries and 5-6 MEPs). The conferences are intended to serve as a vehicle for creating concrete policy recommendations on the Stability Pact. Topics of discussion will include promoting sub-regional co-operation, fostering inter-ethnic relations, and developing parliamentary democracy. Each conference will be followed by a written report. 2) Parliamentary hearings hosted by the EP on issues covering the overall situation in south eastern Europe and the specific needs of the region. 3) Production of a series of policy recommendations about practical ways to implement the Stability Pact. 4) Publications will include background papers, conference reports, policy recommendations, and annual reports.

Summary:

This project is aimed at providing a programme in support of media freedom, professional ethics, ethnic diversity, and respect for human rights in South-eastern Europe. The project has 6 main aims: 1. Building independent and effective trade unions and associations of journalists. Promoting professional journalism in conflict and human rights reporting: preparation and production of a human rights handbook, translation of it, publication on IFJ website and distribution to various media organisations, four conflict reporting training courses, regional workshops 6. Promoting basic standards of safety of journalists: production and distribution of 3000 basic safety kits for journalists based on IFJ safety handbook, production and distribution of safety training manuals.

Central and Eastern Europe: Diversity and Democracy

Summary:

This project is aimed at raising awareness of minorities and minority rights, encouraging cooperation between human rights activists, enhancing local capacities to engage in dialogue with governments and bringing local problems to domestic policy levels and international fora. Activities include: organising training seminars for a total of 90 participants; holding one seminar per year at the Council of Europe for a total of 60 participants; organising interactive workshops (each for 30 participants) on Minority Rights and Development, and Education in Multiethnic Societies; publishing of 3 reports on minorities and minority rights; developing specific country and community projects. 


