on the draft estimates of revenue and expenditure of the European Parliament for the financial year 1981'

Rapporteur: The chairman of the Committee on Budgets

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Mr Bonde was appointed rapporteur on the estimates of revenue and expenditure of the European Parliament for the financial year 1982 on 19 March 1981.

The Committee on Budgets considered the establishment plan and the draft estimates separately.

Pursuant to Rule 49(3) of the Rules of Procedure, it delivered its opinion on the establishment plan on 6 April 1981.

Pursuant to Rule 50(1) of the Rules of Procedure, it delivered its opinion on the preliminary draft estimates to the Bureau on 9 April 1981.

Pursuant to Rule 50(3) of the Rules of Procedure and following the adoption by the enlarged Bureau of the preliminary draft estimates, the Committee on Budgets adopted the draft estimates and voted on the accompanying resolution at its meeting of 23 April 1981.

The latter decisions were taken by a majority vote with 11 votes in favour, 8 against and no abstentions.

The Committee on Budgets decided that the result of its deliberations and the explanatory statement should be presented orally in the plenary sitting by its rapporteur.

Since the rapporteur refused to accept the committee report at the meeting of 24 April 1981, the committee instructed its chairman to present the report to the plenary sitting of Parliament.

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The Committee on Budgets hereby submits to the European Parliament the following motion for a resolution:

#### MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION

on the draft estimates of revenue and expenditure of the European Parliament for 1982.

#### The European Parliament,

- having regard to the decisions of the Bureau and enlarged Bureau and to the draft budgetary estimates for 1982 as forwarded to the Committee on Budgets,
- having regard to the report and draft estimates drawn up by the Committee on Budgets (Doc. 1-173/81),

#### **APPROPRIATIONS**

 adopts the estimates of revenue and expenditure of the European Parliament for 1982 at a figure of 209,229,140 EUA broken down as set out below;

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## CHAPTER 1.2 — ALLOWANCES AND EXPENSES ON ENTERING AND LEAVING THE SERVICE AND ON TRANSFER (cont'd)

They are paid to staff obliged to change their place of residence upon taking up their duties, on leaving the service or upon transfer to a new place of work.
