MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION

tabled by Mrs CHARZAT, Mrs PERY, Mr SABY and Mrs VAYSSADE

pursuant to Rule 47 of the Rules of Procedure

on public employment agencies

PE 79.779

The European Parliament,

- A having regard to Article 118 of the Treaty of Rome concerning a Community policy on employment,
- B having regard to the views presented by the Commission to the Standing Committee on Employment on 22 May and 9 October 1979 (SEC (79) 634 final),
- C having regard to the communication from the Commission to the Council of 28 April 1980 (COM(80) 186 final) laying down guidelines for a Community labour market policy,
- D whereas it is important from now on to recognize the rights of workers in the Community by establishing a 'European social security area',
- E whereas one of the major objectives of the Community is a return to a satisfactory level of employment,
- F considering the predominant role of public employment services, recognized by the International Labour Organization, in the registration of vacancies, in placement and in matching (through mobility, vocational training and so on) labour supply and demand,
- G considering the difficulties encountered by agencies in being taken seriously by employers as a result, in particular, of uncontrolled competition from private undertakings (temporary employment agencies, private recruitment services, advertising services etc.)
- 1. Recommends that public employment agencies in all Member States should be given the legal monopoly of placement activities in these countries;
- 2. Proposes to the Member States that more be done to assist public employment agencies on the basis of the following guidelines:
 - active participation by employers' and workers' representatives in public placement services as a means of consolidating the latter's role of monitoring the labour market,
 - improvement of facilities for gathering information on vacancies from firms,
 - development of the vocational guidance and counselling services provided by agencies;
- 3. Calls on the Council of Ministers to seek ways and means of reaching a concensus in the Community on questions such as worker training or the computerisation of agencies.
