THE WEEK IN EUROPE

Delors and Andreotti in Washington. Commission President Jacques Delors and Italian Prime Minister Giulio Andreotti, current Council of Ministers' President, met US President George Bush in Washington DC on Tuesday for long-scheduled talks. On the agenda was the disagreement between Brussels and the US over cuts in farm subsidies in the context of the current Uruguay Round of the GATT talks. Despite the war of words now taking place over the degree to which the EC is prepared to cut farm subsidies, there is the realisation that a breakdown in GATT over agriculture would result in both the US and the EC losing out. Agriculture is just one of the 15 areas covered by the talks and a successful agreement would allow the service industries of the West to move into new markets and protect its intellectual property from piracy. Speaking in Geneva on Monday, Arthur Dunkel, Director-General of GATT, said the negotiations were in a "grave situation" and called for political action to move the talks forward. The current EC proposal, involving cuts of 30% in farm subsidies in the Community, was accepted by EC Ministers only after a series of highly charged meetings. Speaking in London on Tuesday, US Agriculture Secretary Clayton Yeutter said there were only three weeks before the GATT talks were due to be completed in Brussels. He stressed that the US preferred no GATT agreement to a bad one. The row between the EC and the US over this issue has, for the moment, prevented the initialling of the Transatlantic Declaration, an attempt to institutionalise relations between Washington and Brussels. Today (Thursday) the EC General Affairs Council convenes especially to discuss the Uruguay Round. On Friday there will be a Commission-US Government meeting to discuss the same subject.

Delors at General Affairs Council. In the General Affairs Council on Monday in Brussels, President Jacques Delors submitted the Commission's viewpoint on matters varying from the GATT talks to next week's CSCE Summit. Delors said the Commission and the Netherlands could now propose to the CSCE the idea of a European Energy Charter, involving the countries of Central and Eastern Europe. He also underlined the "extremely positive nature" of the EFTA declaration of 23 October concerning the evolution of EC-EFTA relations and the creation of a European Economic Space. The Commission President also told the Council that the agreements to negotiate more wide-ranging trade and cooperation agreements with Czechoslovakia, Poland and Hungary should be adopted on 4 December.

Millan on EMU. Speaking at the Royal Institute of International Affairs in London on Tuesday, Commissioner Bruce Millan said that the impetus given by the Rome Council on Economic and Monetary Union meant that we must intensify our efforts towards economic and social cohesion, as a necessary corollary of closer economic and political integration, "so that the benefits of EMU are felt by all regions of the Community". EC Foreign Ministers on Iraq. At their meeting on Monday EC Foreign Minsters decided to encourage the UN Secretary-General in his action over Iraq and urged the Iraq authorities to receive Javier Perez de Cuellar's special representative.

Sally Greengross, Director of Age Concern England and Secretary General of Eurolink Age which she set up in 1980, has been selected as the British Woman of Europe to hold the title for 1991. She was chosen from a list of nominations presented by the UK media and individuals. Sally has been invited to Brussels on 7th and 8th December with the Women of Europe nominated from the eleven other member countries of the European Community. She will receive her award then and one of the twelve will be chosen as the 1991 Woman of Europe. <u>Debt write-off for ACPs.</u> The Commission is proposing that Member States write-off debts owed by the countries of Africa, the Caribbean and the Pacific (ACP) to the Community under the Lome Convention. These debts amount to some 1,010m ecus (£707m) out of a total of 130,000m ecus (£91,000m) owed by these countries globally.

Millan proposes land-use study. Regional Policy Commissioner Bruce Millan has received Commission approval for a discussion paper looking at the trends and pressures likely to shape land use and planning towards the year 2,000. The paper will be studied at the meeting of Regional Policy and Planning Ministers in Turin on 23-24 November.

Satellite Broadcasting. The Commission is putting forward a new Green Paper suggesting a Community approach to satellite broadcasting and communications which are assuming increasing importance as 1992 approaches. Vice-President Filippo Pandolfi told the Commission Wednesday that the debate initiated by the document will permit the elaboration of specific proposals from the Commission.

Tobacco Labelling. Social Affairs Commissioner Vasso Papandreou is putting proposals before the Council to tighten up health warnings on packets of tobacco. A new optional warning should be added: "Smoking causes addiction". One cancer in three in Europe is said to be caused by smoking.

Women on TV. In Athens last Friday Cultural Affairs Commissioner Jean Dondelinger presented the NIKE awards for television programmes best illustrating the role of women in present-day society. Britain's Central TV took the prize in the section comprising Children and Young People.
