At its meeting of 13 April 1976, the Committee on Budgets appointed Miss C. FLESCH rapporteur.

At its meeting of 7 April 1976, the Bureau drew up, pursuant to Rule 50(1) of the Rules of Procedure, the preliminary draft estimates of Parliament.

The Committee on Budgets considered this document (PE 44.126/BUR) on 29 April and 11 May 1976 on the basis of a note from the Secretary-General (PE 44.196/BUR). At the latter meeting it adopted its opinion (PE 44.388/fin.) for the Bureau.

At its meeting of 13 May 1976, the Bureau adopted the preliminary draft estimates, which it referred to the Committee on Budgets by letter of 14 May 1976.

The Committee on Budgets considered the preliminary draft estimates on 13 and 19 May 1976.

At the latter meeting it considered and adopted the draft report and established the draft estimates by 9 votes to 4 with 1 abstention.

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The Committee on Budgets hereby submits to the European Parliament the following motion for a resolution, together with explanatory statement:

#### MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION

Α

on the draft estimates of revenue and expenditure of the European Parliament for the financial year 1977

#### The European Parliament,

- having regard to Rules 49 and 50 of its Rules of Procedure.
- having regard to the draft estimates drawn up by the committee responsible, and to the accompanying report (Doc. 130/76).
- (a) considering that the establishment plan should be stabilized and the increase in numerical strength kept to a minimum;
- (b) considering that, while allowing for certain increases attributable to the constant development of its activities and to certain rises in costs, the increase in appropriations shown in the estimates should be kept to a minimum;
- (c) pointing out that it will not allow for increases relating to the forecast rises in staff salaries until a number of decisions have been taken on this matter at Community level (in other words when the draft annual budget of the Communities is considered);

#### A. Establishment plan

#### 1. Creates

- (a) 36 new permanent posts and 1 new temporary post,
- (b) a reserve of 22 posts, corresponding to the number of officials at present seconded in the interests of the service to the political groups,
- (c) 8 temporary posts in the secretariat of the political groups,
- (d) by decision of the Bureau, 10 new posts to strengthen the establishment of drivers, security services and of certain facilities in Brussels.

#### 2. Regrades

(a) 17 permanent posts shown on the establishment plan

(b) 35 posts included in the establishment plan of the political groups in accordance with the following detailed breakdown.

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#### B. Estimates proper

- 3. Establishes its estimates of revenue and expenditure for 1977 at 55,274,994 u.a.;
- 4. Stresses that it will amend its estimates when it examines the draft budget of the Communities for 1977, in particular to take account of decisions relating to increases in staff salaries and for the reasons set out in the explanatory statement accompanying this resolution;
- 5. Instructs its President, pursuant to the provisions of Article 203 of the Treaty, to forward this resolution, the estimates annexed thereto and the report of its committee, to the Commission of the European Communities and, for information, to the Council of the European Communities.

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#### EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

#### I. - Introduction

1. The estimates of the European Parliament for 1977 meet the requirement for stability. They have been modified, in regard to the establishment plan and to the appropriations, to allow:

- firstly, for posts which are essential in view of the increase in activities, and
- secondly, for increases in appropriations resulting from both the development of activities and certain rises in costs.

2. Provision has not yet been made in the estimates for increases liable to result from decisions on the adjustment of staff salaries. These increases will be taken into consideration when the draft annual budget of the Communities for 1977 is examined.

II. - Data on the quantitative and qualitative development of Parliament's
 activities

3. There has been a considerable increase in Parliament's activities in 1976. This has obviously resulted in an increase in the workload of all the Directorates-General.

In this connection, the information set in the Secretary-General's document of 31 March 1976 speaks for itself, especially as regards the Directorate-General for Sessional and General Services and the Directorate-General for Committees and Inter-Parliamentary Delegations which are more directly involved in parliamentary activities as such.

III. - Estimates for 1977

#### A. Establishment plan

#### (a) Rationalization of services

4. The Committee on Budgets has given even more urgent attention than last year to the problem of rationalizing the work of the Parliament's secretariat. It endorsed the view of the Secretary-General that the possibilities for rationalization are objectively limited by the multilingual system and the dispersion of Parliament's places of work. Nonetheless it considers that a study must be made of possible staff cuts (where necessary) or of more effective and rational use of existing staff, with a view in particular to greater stabilization of the establishment plan.

(b) <u>Creation of 36 permanent posts and 1 temporary post</u>: <u>1 A 5/4, 1 A 7/6, 6 LA 5/4, 4 B 3/2, 4 B 5/4, 3 Cl, 14 C 3/2</u> including 1 temporary post, 1 C 5/4, 2 Dl, 1 D 3/2

5. These posts constitute the increase necessary to cope with the expanding activities of the Directorate-General for Sessional and General Services (1 post of revisor LA 5/4 for each language division and the corresponding posts for secretaries C 3/2), the Directorate-General for Information (2 B 3/2, 1 B 5/4, 2 Cl), the Directorate-General for Committees (1 B 3/2, 4 C 3/2), the Directorate-General for Administration (1 A 7/6, 1 B 3/2, 2 B 5/4, 1 Cl, 2 C 3/2, 2 Dl, 1 D 3/2), the Directorate-General for Research (1 A 5/4, 1 B 5/4, 1 C 3/2, 1 C 5/4) and the Office of the President (1 C 3/2 temporary).

To the extent that this increase is necessary to cope with expanding activities. The Committee on Budgets has adopted a favourable opinion.

- (c) <u>Creation of a reserve of 22 posts corresponding to the number</u> of officials seconded to the political groups
- 6. The Committee on Budgets has noted that:
- posts vacated by officials seconded to the political groups can only be filled on a temporary basis (which is prejudicial to the interests both of the services and of the temporary staff concerned);
- in the absence of a Council decision on this matter, it is still impossible to apply new provisions of the staff regulations which would have the consequence of releasing posts vacated by officials seconded in the interests of the service.

Consequently, the Committee on Budgets:

- considering that the creation of a reserve of posts equal to the number of staff at present seconded (22 broken down as follows: 1 LA 4, 1 LA 7, 1 A5, 1 A7, 1 B3, 1 B5, 1 C1, 7 C2, 7 C3, 1 C4) entails no additional expenditure;
- having regard firstly to the fact that for some of these posts vacated by officials seconded to the groups and at present occupied by temporary staff, salaries are already being paid, and secondly to the fact that posts are to be provided which would only be filled if some of these 22 officials returned to the secretariat;
- In the absence of a more satisfactory solution, endorses the proposals for the constitution of this reserve;
- 2. Proposes, however, to make the necessary representations to the Council for the relevant new provisions of the staff regulations to be adopted so that this reserve would be in future either reduced or not further increased.
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(d) Other decisions of the Bureau on the creation of new posts

7. By decision of the Bureau of Parliament, the following posts have also been created:

- 1 Cl, for supervisory functions in the drivers' section;

- 1 Cl, for a branch of the travel bureau in Brussels;

- 2 D 3/2, for the Brussels facility;

- 3 D 3/2, to increase the number of drivers;

- 1 A 7/6, to strengthen the security service;

- 2 C 1, as part of the strengthening of the security service.

The Committee takes note of this decision, as the Bureau has the final say on the establishment plan.

(e) <u>Regrading of posts</u>

8. It has been decided to regrade the following 17 posts:2 A 5/4 to A 3, 2 B3/2 to B1, 2 B5/4 to B 3/2, 11 C 3/2 to C1.

The following considerations should be noted in connection with the regrading of these posts:

- the incumbents of these posts all easily meet the requirements for promotion;

- no regrading from one category to another is involved.

The regrading of a number of these posts has been requested because of the increased importance of the duties involved.

9. The following posts are to be regraded:

- Office of the President (1 B2 to B1);

- Directorate-General for Committees (1 A 5/4 to A3, 8 C 3/2 to Cl);
- Directorate-General for Information(1A5/4 to A3, 1 C 3/2 to Cl);
- Directorate-General for Administration (1 B3/2 to B1, 1 B 5/4 to B 3/2, 1 C 3/2 to C 1);
- Directorate-General for Research (1 B 5/4 to B 3/2);
- Secretariat of the Staff Committee (1 C 3/2 to Cl).

#### (f) <u>Secretariat of the Committee on Budgets and of the</u> <u>Sub Committee on Budgetary Control</u>

10. The Committee on Budgets reserves the right to reconsider the question of the organization of its own secretariat and of the secretariat of the sub-committee on budgetary control when it examines the entire budget of the Communities in the autumn. It will then take account of its decisions on the terms of reference of its sub-committees, the role and function of parliamentary control of Community revenue and expenditure and the resulting increase in the activities of its secretariat.

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#### (g) <u>Regrading of posts in the financial control division</u>

11. While recognizing as well-founded the reasons for which the regrading of certain posts is envisaged, it has been decided to <u>defer</u> decisions on the regradings requested for the financial control division (1 A7/6 to A 5/4, 1 B 5/4 to B 3/2) pending examination of all the problems connected with the restructuring of control activities including those relating to internal control of the Parliament.

#### (h) Local staff

12. The Staff Committee has proposed that all local staff should be established. After considering the different views on this subject, the Committee on Budgets and the Bureau of Parliament felt that it was more appropriate, as matters stand at present and despite the disadvantages created for the staff members concerned by the concurrent existence of established personnel and local staff covered by ad hoc arrangements, to adhere to the principle of establishment laid down last year and consequently to <u>defer</u> a general measure to establish all local staff and to <u>take into consideration only</u> <u>those cases in which it is clearly apparent</u> - as in the case of the local posts converted into established posts last year - <u>that the duties involved</u> <u>are permanent</u>, <u>supervisory or other duties not covered by a description in the staff regulations</u>. The Secretary-General is therefore instructed to make appropriate proposals after consulting the Staff Committee. These proposals may result in certain adjustments to the establishment plan of the secretariat when the budget of the Communities for 1977 is considered as a whole.

#### (i) Establishment plans of the groups

#### Creation of posts

13. The creation of 8 posts has been proposed, half of them in category C (1 C3 in the Christian-Democratic Group, 1 A4, 1 C1 and 1 C3 in the Socialist Group, 1 C3 in the Liberal Group, 1 C3 in the Conservative Group, 1 A7 and 1 C3 in the Communist Group) to consolidate the structure of the existing secretariats.

The Committee on Budgets is able to <u>endorse these proposals</u>. However, it stresses that there must be no further modification after this consolidation, at least until there is a substantial change in the activities of the European Parliament following its election by direct universal suffrage.

#### New distribution of posts within the 2 grades of the different careers

14. New posts in the secretariat of the political groups in 1974 were created in the basic grade of the career. It seems desirable to distribute these posts more satisfactorily within the careers, partly to ensure some possibility of promotion. The Committee on Budgets <u>is able to agree</u> to this new distribution of posts within the grades of the different careers.

#### Other changes in the establishment plans of the groups

15. Among the other requests for changes in the group establishment plans, three post conversions not falling within the existing career have been decided: 1 A5 for the Christian-Democrats, 1 Bl for the European Progressive Democrats and 1 A5 for the Communists.

The conversions referred to in points 14 and 15 above, relate to 35 posts, broken down as follows:

#### I - Conversions outside career bracket:

1 A 6 to A 5 in the Christian-Democratic Group 1 A 6 to A 5 in the Communist Group 1 B 2 to B 1 in the EPD Group

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II - Conversions within career bracket:

2 A 5 to 2 A 4: 1 1	in the CD Group in the EPD Group
13 A 7 to 13 A 6:	4 in the CD Group 5 in the Socialist Group 1 in the Liberal Group 1 in the Conservative Group 2 in the EPD Group
6 B 3 to 6 B 2:	2 in the Socialist Group 1 in the Liberal Group 2 in the Conservative Group 1 in the Communist Group
11 C 3 to 11 C 2:.	3 in the CD Group 3 in the Socialist Group 3 in the Conservative Group 2 in the EPD Group

16. The Committee on Budgets considers that the changes to the establishment plan in respect of which it has delivered a favourable opinion, should enable the secretariat of the Parliament and of the political groups to be <u>consolidated not only for 1977 but</u>, unless imperative needs arise, until the election of the Parliament by direct universal suffrage.

#### B. Estimates proper

#### (j) Rate of increase of expenditure

17. In the light of the decisions taken on the establishment plan and the increases explained below, the draft estimates, submitted to Parliament by the Committee on Budgets, total 55,274,994 u.a. This represents an increase of 3,153,785 u.a. over the appropriations for 1976 (52,121,209 u.a.). The percentage increase is 6.05%

18. In its estimates, Parliament will therefore in all probability not exceed the maximum rate established by the Commission of the Communities in accordance with Article 203(8) of the EEC Treaty for the annual increase in expenditure other than that necessarily resulting from the Treaty, where the figure is 17.3%.

This seems to be a reasonable working hypothesis but it cannot be definitive since increases in respect of salaries will not be added until November when the Parliament will have to deliver its opinion on the budget of the Communities. The increases will depend on decisions taken at Community level and it should be noted that expenditure on personnel makes up some 62% of the Parliament's total expenditure.

The small average increase of 6.05% does not even cover the average rise in costs in the current year. It has been obtained only by a determined effort to reduce expenditure, a policy advocated by the Committee on Budgets. However, in view of the additional fact that over 95% of the budgetary appropriations are normally used, certain adjustments, due to unforeseen developments or unexpected increases in certain costs, may be necessary in November when the Parliament comes to examine the draft budget of the Communities.

#### (k) Election of the Parliament by direct universal suffrage

19. The fairly modest increases in appropriations do not of course allow for the possible impact on the estimates of the election of the European Parliament by universal suffrage. If, as is desirable, elections are held in 1978, it will obviously be necessary to introduce a supplementary budget during the financial year (1977) to bring the existing appropriations into line with the Parliament's new dimension.

(1) Principal increases

## 20. Title I - 'Expenditure relating to persons working with the Institution'

The appropriations for this Title have been increased from 36,932,620 u.a. to 38,396,080 u.a. This Title shows the biggest increases and in any case represents on its own some 68% of total appropriations. The increases in Chapter 10 'Members of the Institution' (from 4,102,050 u.a. to 4,279,050 u.a.) are primarily due to the fact that the membership of the Parliament is now complete while there has also been a slight adjustment to the reimbursement of travel expenses per km and to the Members' secretarial allowance.

The increase in appropriations in Chapter 11 (Staff) (29,958,720 u.a. to 31,411,730 u.a.) is mainly attributable to the increase and changes in the establishment plan. It should be repeated at this point that no allowance has yet been made for the salary increases which may be decided at the end of the year.

## 21. Title 2 - 'Buildings, equipment and miscellaneous operating expenditure'

The appropriations under this Title have been increased from 9,787,535 u.a. to 11,029,335 u.a. The following general points should be noted:

- appropriations for rental of buildings (Chapter 21) remain on the high side (increased from 5,003,150 u.a. to 5,439,950 u.a.) since there has not yet been any change in one of the characteristics of the Parliament's activities, namely the lack of a single seat; - the increases in miscellaneous operating expenditure covered by Chapters 22 to 27, represent an adjustment to the rise in certain costs.

## 22. Title 3 - 'Expenditure resulting from the Institution carrying out special functions'

Appropriations under this Title show an increase from 1,944,553 u.a. to 2,287,079 u.a. This rise is primarily due to the increase in appropriations for item 3705 'Contribution to secretariat of the political groups of the European Parliament' (from 567,657 u.a. to 680,000 u.a.) and item 3706 'Other political activities' (from 115,000 to 230,000 u.a.).

These increases result primarily from the 20% rise in the fixed sum and proportional component of the contributions paid by Parliament to the political groups; increased costs of travel and missions by officials of the group secretariats; increase in the level of additional political activities leading up to election of the European Parliament by direct universal suffrage. On the latter point, it should be noted that the programme of activities will not build up to full strength until a definite date has been fixed for the elections.

23. Parliament's contribution to the expenditure of the Audit Board and ECSC Auditor (for some years now Parliament has entered 50% of these expenses in its estimates, the other 50% being shown in the Council's estimates) has been increased in the light of proposals from the two bodies concerned.

#### 24. Title 9 'Other expenditure'

The appropriations entered under this title are practically the same as in 1976 (increase from 2,806,500 u.a. to 2,891,500 ú.a.).

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25. The Committee on Budgets has attempted to hold the increase in expenditure to a minimum. However it deserves to be streased once again that allowance has had to be made for objective constraints which severely limit possible reductions through rationalization of the Parliament's activities. It would also have been misguided to seek to reduce the few rises resulting from the increases in parliamentary activities proper.

It remains for the Committee on Budgets to make sure that the most sparing possible use is made - as is desirable - of the appropriations during the financial year.
