By letter of 4 December 1973 the President of the Council of the European Communities requested the European Parliament, pursuant to Article 43 of the EEC Treaty, to deliver an opinion on the proposal from the Commission of the European Communities to the Council for a regulation on the total or partial suspension of the Common Customs Tariff duties on certain agricultural products originating in Turkey (Doc. 267/73).

On 10 December 1973 the President of the European Parliament referred this proposal to the Committee on External Economic Relations as the committee responsible and the Committee on Agriculture as the committee asked for its opinion.

The Committee on External Economic Relations appointed Mr BOANO rapporteur on 12 December 1973.

It considered this proposal at its meeting of 12 December 1973.

At the same meeting the Committee unanimously adopted the motion for a resolution.

The following were present : Mr Boano, Vice-President and rapporteur, Mr Klepsch, Mr Lange, Lord Lothian, Sir John Peel, Mr Scholten, Mr Thornley.

The opinion of the Committee on Agriculture is attached.

1. The first part of the document discusses the importance of maintaining accurate records of all transactions. It emphasizes that this is crucial for the company's financial health and for providing reliable information to stakeholders.

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the proposal from the Commission to the Council for a regulation on the total or partial suspension of Common Customs Tariff duties on certain agricultural products originating in Turkey (Doc. 267/73),
 - having been consulted by the Council pursuant to Article 43 of the EEC Treaty (Doc. 267/73),
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on External Economic Relations and the opinion of the Committee on Agriculture (Doc. 294/73),
1. Approves the proposal for a regulation on the total or partial suspension of Common Customs Tariff duties on certain agricultural products originating in Turkey;
 2. Instructs its President to forward this resolution and the report of its Committee to the Council and Commission of the European Communities.
