4. In memoriam

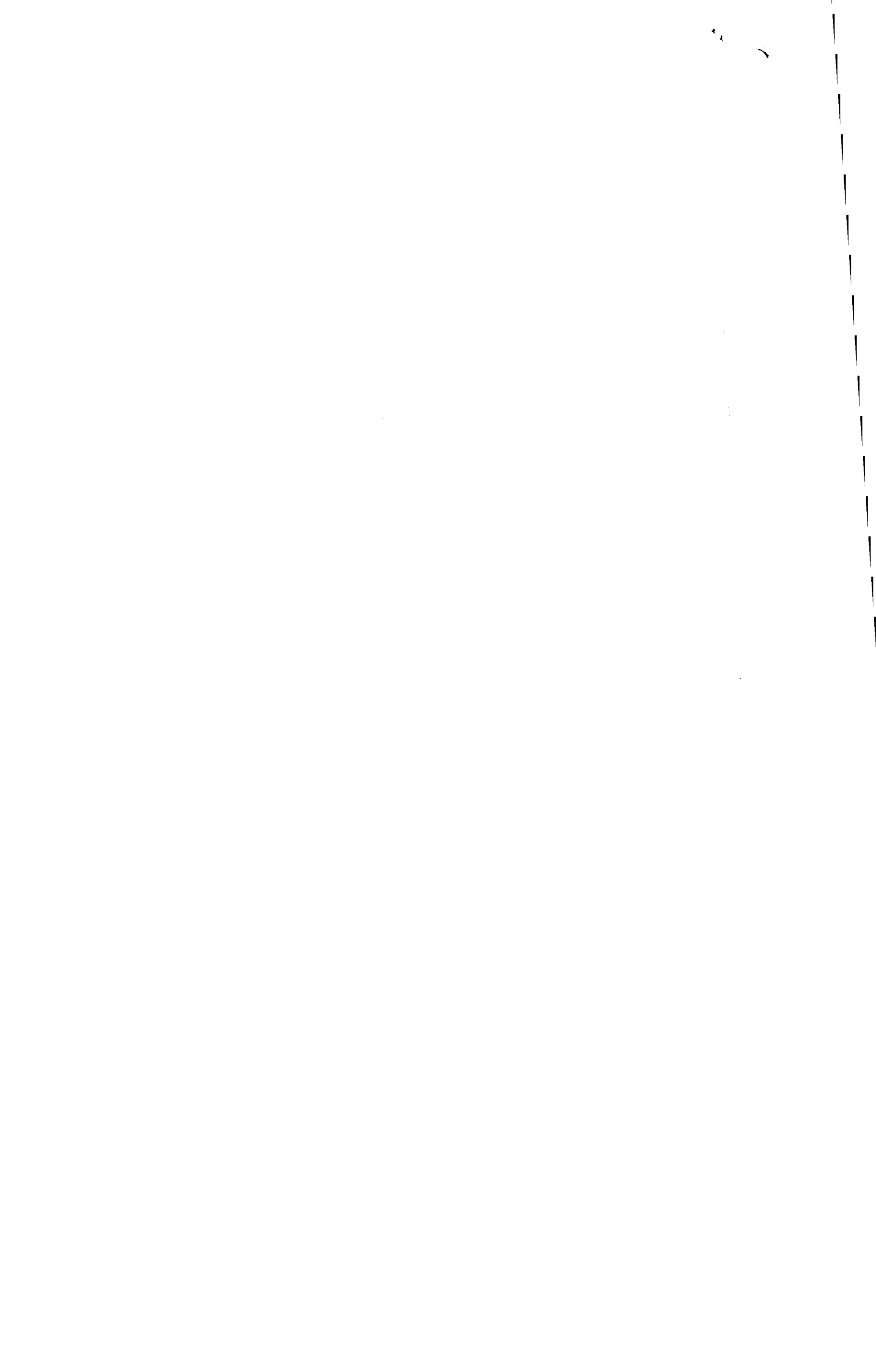

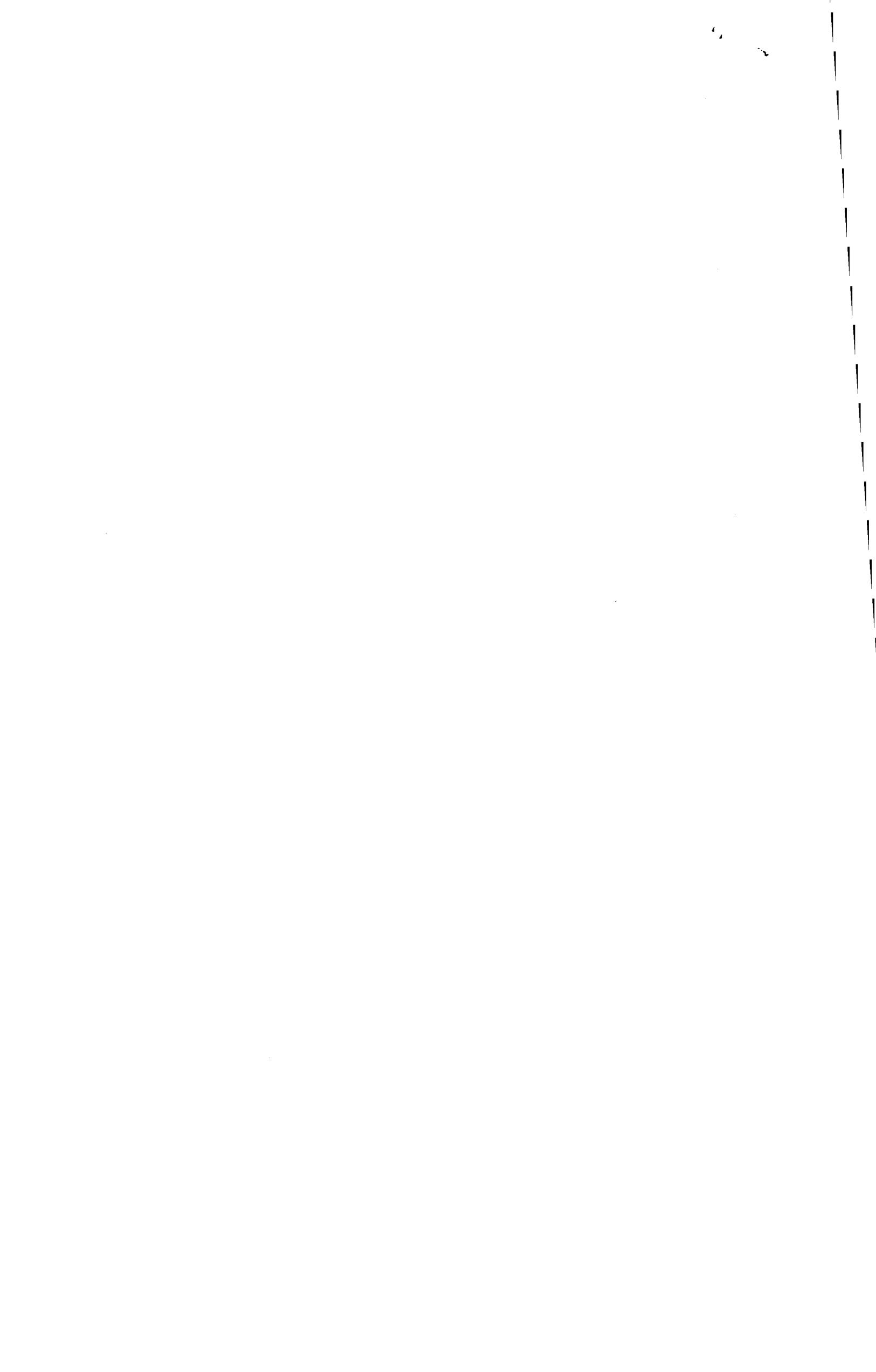

On a proposal from the President, the Assembly set 9.30 the following morning as the deadline for tabling amendments to all the items on the agenda and for tabling all other documents.

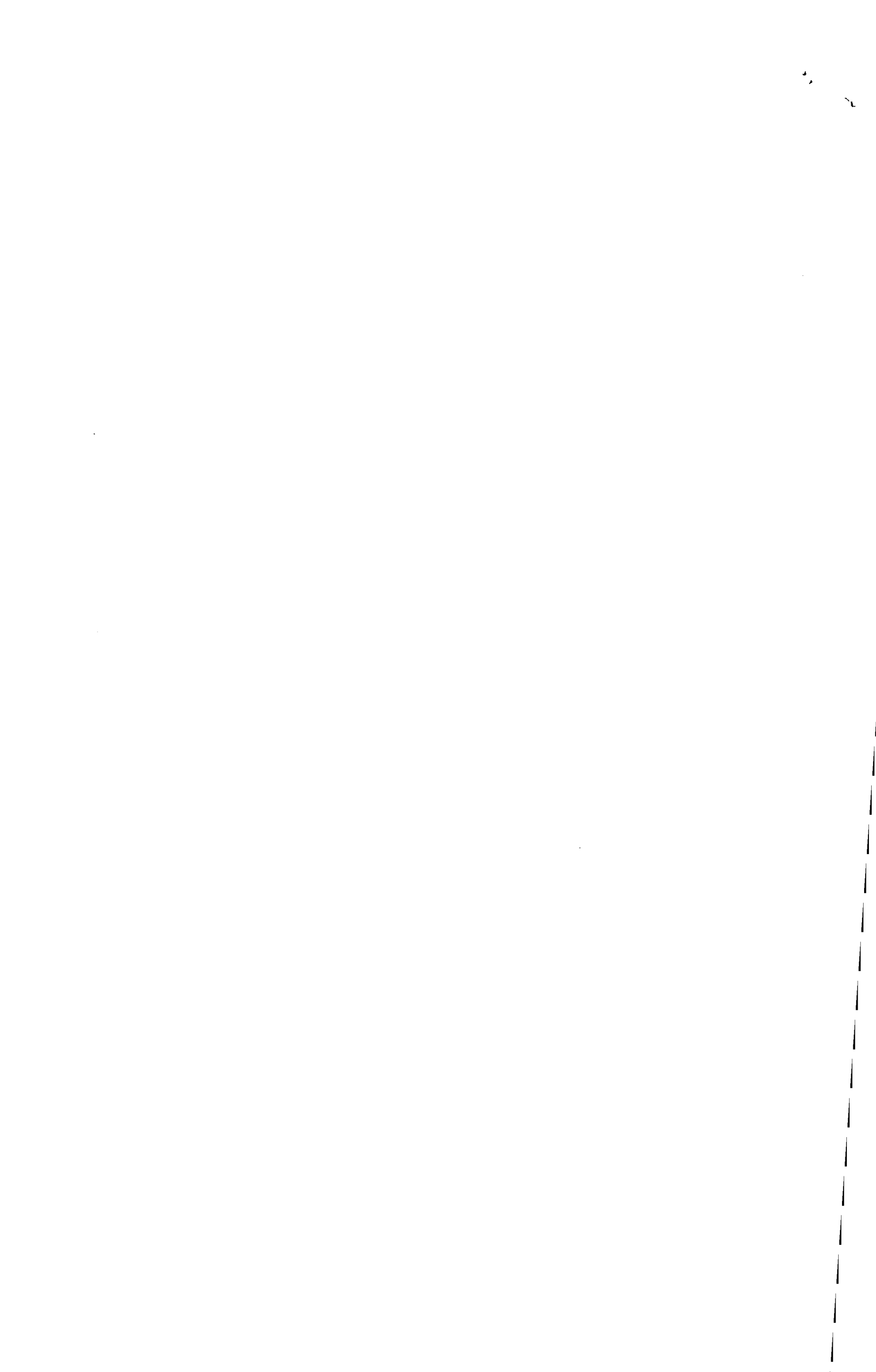
He pointed out that, to speed matters up, the Bureau had decided that all amendments seeking to delete parts of a text would be recorded and announced in the vote but not translated.
