**COMMISSION CLOSES ANTI-DUMPING INVESTIGATION INTO IMPORTS OF
TITANIUM MILL PRODUCTS FROM JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES**

The Commission has just closed its anti-dumping investigation into imports of certain titanium mill products from Japan and the United States without taking any protective measures.

The products involved were pure titanium in the form of sheets or strips used in the chemical and tubing industries and titanium alloys for use in the aerospace industry. (Nimex codes ex 81.04.59 and ex 81.04.61).

Of the 10 Japanese and American firms exporting these products to the Community nine of them were found either not to be dumping, or to be dumping with margins of less than 1.3%. In the case of the remaining firm, Nippon Stainless Steel Co., a dumping margin of 8.8% was found but this company holds an EC market share of only 1.8%

Given the low dumping margin or low export volumes involved, the Commission has concluded that Japanese and American exports of titanium mill products, were not responsible for any material injury to the Community industry and has accordingly closed the anti-dumping investigation.
