# PROPOSAL FOR A COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC)

concerning, for certain fish stocks occurring in the Community fishing zone, the fixing of the total allowable catches for 1981 and the shares available to the Community

(presented by the Commission to the Council)

# EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This proposal for a Council Regulation (EEC) consolidates the proposals for total allowable catches (TACs) in 1981 which the Commission made to the Council in November 1980 (1) together with the subsequent amendments (2). It does not include certain footnotes which the Commission had until now included in the Annex to its proposed TAC Regulation 1981; the material in these footnotes is now being dealt with in a separate proposal for a Regulation. Consequently the previous proposals concerned are withdrawn.

This consolidated proposal is being made in circumstances where the agreements with Norway and the Faroes and the framework agreement and the joint management agreement with Canada have not been approved and where no agreement has been reached with Sweden for reciprocal fishing rights nor with Sweden/Norway concerning the Skagerrak. The proposal takes this situation into account by proposing autonomous TACs for stocks in Community waters only West of Greenland at the same level as would have been available to the Community for 1981 if the joint management agreement with Canada had been approved except in the case of West Greenland shrimp where, pursuant to the decision of the Council of 11 February last an autonomous TAC of 30.000 tonnes has been fixed for 1981; in the case of Norway and the Faroes the proposal allows for the reciprocal quantities agreed in negotiations with each of them; in the case of stocks in Skagerrak, Kattegat and Baltic the proposals remain the same as those earlier made to Norway/Sweden and to Sweden respectively.

In view of the implementation in 1980 of the increase to 80 mm of the minimum mesh size in the Hake fishery, the Commission proposes an upward revision of the TAC for Hake in ICES sub-areas IV, VI, VII and division VIIIa,b from 30.000 to 38.630. Of this TAC an amount of 28.130 is reserved to the Community. An amount of 3.000 tonnes is similarly reserved out of the TAC of 32.000 tonnes for anchovies in ICES sub-area VIII.

The amendments which need to be made to the Commission's earlier TAC proposals for 1981 in order to take account of the abovementioned factors have been carried into this consolidated TAC proposal.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, Zand in particular Article 43 thereof \*/ \*)

Having regard to Regulation (EEC) No. / of establishing a Community system for the conservation and management of fishery resources (1) and in particular Articles 3 and 4, thereof;

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission;

/ Having regard to the opinion of the European Parliament (2) /; \*)

Whereas in order to ensure the protection of the fishing grounds and stocks of fish and to ensure thereby a balanced exploitation of the resources of the sea in the interests of both fishermen and consumers, there should be fixed each year for each species requiring a limitation of catches, a total allowable catch (TAC) per stock or group of stocks, the share of the TACs available for the Community, taking into account commitments to third countries;

HAD ADOPTED THE FOLLOWING REGULATION :

### Article 1

The total allowable catches (TAC) fixed for 1981, on the basis of stocks or groups of stocks, in the waters under the sovereignty or jurisdiction of the Member States and subject to Community fishing regulations, together with the shares of these TACs available for the Community, are set out in the annex hereto.

# / Article 2

The Council, acting by a qualified majority on a proposal from the Commission, may modify the annex of this Regulation in order, if necessary, to take account of new scientific advice becoming available, changes in any other of the factors on which the provisions of this Regulation are based and any subsequent modifications in the agreements reached with interested non-member States about the allocation to them of quotas for fishing in the Community fishing zone in 1981. 7 \*)

# Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the 3rd day after publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

It is applicable from 1.1.1981.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and shall be directly applicable in all Member States.
