COMMISSION REPORT TO THE COUNCIL ON THE FORESEEABLE DEVELOPMENTS IN THE PLANTING AND REPLANTING OF VINEYARDS IN THE COMMUNITY AND ON THE RATIO BETWEEN PRODUCTION AND UTILIZATION IN THE WINE SECTOR

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I. INTRODUCTION

The "vineyards report" for 1975/76 pointed out the low reliability of forecasts based on producers' declarations of intent to plant, replant or grub. Since then the situation has not changed appreciably and successive reports have expressed the same reservations on the validity of the forecasts of areas under vines contained in them. When the idea of a viticultural land register was abandoned and replaced by Council Regulation (EEC) No 357/79 on statistical surveys of areas under vines (1), doubts arose as to whether producers should, for statistical purposes, continue to be obliged to declare their intentions on planting, replanting and grubbing of vineyards. Some wine-producing countries, in particular the Federal Republic of Germany, have stressed the need to reduce and simplify growers' obligations. In the case in point, the inadequate degree of validity of the data collected on the one hand and Member States' obligation to carry out statistical surveys on the other have led to the conclusion that declarations of intent are no longer of any use for statistical purposes. The basic regulation has recently been amended to this effect (Council Regulation (EEC) No 3577/82 (2)).

This being so, and as the Federal Republic of Germany does not have figures for 1980/81 based on declarations of intent, it is not thought that there would be any point in analysing foreseeable developments on the basis of such declarations. The figures, given in Tables 1, 2, 3 and 5 will not therefore be commented on. The figures which will be analysed are those for operations actually carried out; they are for 1979/80.

It should be pointed out that the figures for the area under vines in the Community will not for a few years yet be uniform or, therefore, completely comparable. Whereas in France, Germany and Luxembourg the basic surveys provided for in Regulation (EEC) No 357/79 were carried out in 1980, and the figures are now beginning to become available, they will not be carried out in Italy and Greece until 1982 and figures are not likely to be ready until early 1984.

This is not likely to jeopardize the drawing up of final rules governing plantings, as these are not due to be implemented until after 1 October 1986. Until then, the "stand-still" will apply. The availability of uniform data for all the countries concerned from 1984 should enable the necessary proposals to be drawn up in time.

II. WINE-GROWING AREAS IN THE COMMUNITY

1. Developments in the different wine-producing Member States

a) Germany: a reversal in the trend

For the first time there was a fall in the total area under vines in Germany. In 1979/80, there were 99 129 ha under vines as against 102 125 the previous year. This fall of about 3 000 ha is largely accounted for by newly-planted areas not yet in production, the trend of which has been downward since 1974/75. This decrease is in turn attributable to the almost complete ban in Germany on new plantings, and this makes it likely that over the next few years the total area will stabilize at slightly below the present figure.

b) France: area still falling but more slowly

The total area under vines fell by 17 027 ha, to a total of 1 177 771 hectares (1 289 000 ha in 1975/76). New plantings not yet in production amounted to only 47 125 ha. Since on average vines begin to produce in the fourth year after planting, the rate of renewal of vineyards (1 177 771 + 47 125) has fallen to about 1.33%. This gives a vineyard

an average life of about 75 years. If this trend continues the average age of vineyards will increase appreciably and production potential will fall.

c) Italy : further slight fall

The fall in total area which began in 1977/78 continued. In 1979/80, 9 124 ha went out of production, leaving a total of 1 159 678 ha. The rate of renewal is even lower than in France, at about 1.08%, corresponding to an average vineyard life of over 92 years. If this trend were to continue, the future soundness of wine production would be jeopardized.

d) Luxembourg : fairly stable

There was a fall of 3 ha (0.2%), but also an increase of 10 ha in the area not yet in production. The rate of vineyard renewal (3.4%) is a guarantee of a sound production structure.

2. Trend at Community level

At Community level the total area under vines fell by 29 000 ha, or 1.2% of the whole. As compared with 1976/77, when the prohibition on new plantings for table wine and the granting of aid for the conversion of vineyards were introduced, the total area in the Community producing wine grapes was down by 5.2%. The same period saw an appreciable fall in new plantings not yet in production (down 45.5%). The vineyard renewal rate fell to about 1.3%, indicating a progressive ageing of the Community vineyard as a whole.

As regards table grapes, there was a slight rise (0.4%) in total Community acreage, as a result of an appreciable fall in France (down 1 387 ha or 3.8%) and an increase in Italy (up 1 820 ha or 2.5%). These figures would seem to suggest that there is going to be a considerable contraction of table grape vineyards in France, whereas in Italy some of the losses in previous years were made up.

III. THE MARKET SITUATION

1. Demand for wine in the Community

Output reached record levels in 1979/80. Although stocks had not been very high, availabilities at the beginning of the wine year were the biggest ever. This led to an increase in direct human consumption, probably due to an increase in consumption by the growers themselves. This recovery is therefore not likely to last and will not affect the medium-term trend in consumption, which is downward: the provisional figures for 1980/81 show a fall in consumption not only over 1979/80 but also as against 1978/79. Overall consumption is flat (and sometimes falling) in the non-producing countries, and falling - progressively but irregularly - in the main producer countries. If there is no new policy to encourage uptake of vine products, this tendency may lead to very serious problems of market balance in the sector.

We should not let ourselves be deceived by the steep increase in total utilizations in 1979/80 (and in 1980/81), which is due almost exclusively to distillation with Community financing (18 231 000 hl in 1979/80 and 22 400 000 hl approx. in 1980/81), in order to get rid of some of the surplus holding down the market.

The effect of the record harvest in 1979 was to upset the balance between supply and demand causing a general drop in market prices for table wines. With confirmation of the estimates of this abundant harvest, prices of table wines of types R I and R II slid below the activating price at the beginning of September. This downward trend continued in October and November and persisted until April 1980. Between April/May and the end of the marketing year there was a progressive climb in both types of wine, mainly due to the intervention measures to stabilize the market, although this reaction was less marked in Italy and France. Neither in Italy nor in France, however, were table wine prices at or above the activating price at the end of the marketing year.

For type R I wine the weighted annual average of prices in France was 7.5% higher than in Italy, while Italian prices were 3% above French prices to Type R II.

Prices for type A I table wines followed an almost identical pattern in France and Italy until January 1980, when they were both below the activating price. From then on prices in France rose sharply to above the activating price, around which they then fluctuated until the end of the marketing year. Italian prices climbed slightly from January onwards, then fell in April and remained fairly stationary, still considerably below the activating price, until the end of the marketing year.

The annual weighted average price for type A I wine in France was 10.2% higher than in Italy.

The prices for types R III and A III wine were satisfactory, their annual weighted averages being 37% and 30% respectively above the guide price. The prices of type A II suffered a steady decline, so that by May they were below the activating price, but from July onwards they climbed above it.

All the "normal intervention measures provided for in the Community rules were applied. In addition, because of the abundant supplies and the fall in market prices at the start of 1979/80, all possible "exceptional" intervention measures were taken in order to stabilize the market:

- at the start of the marketing year:
 - authorization to conclude long-term storage contracts for table wines, grape must and concentrated grape must;
 - distillation carried out under the "guarantee of performance" (reserved for holders of long-term storage contracts);
 - preventive distillation and the distillation of wines suitable for yielding certain vinous spirits with a registered designation of origin.
- at the start of 1980 the distillation of so-called additional obligatory deliveries for distillation (distillation of additional quantities in connection with the obligatory distillation of by-products of wine-making) and the so-called "exceptional" distillation. The quantities of wine distilled with Community aid, under the various measures, amounted to about 18.2 million hl (compared with 1.7 million hl in 1978/79).

The monthly average quantities covered by storage contracts amounted to 27.1 million hl (8.9 million hl in 1978/79), the maximum figure being 41.7 million hl (14.1 million hl in 1979/80).

In 1981 refunds were granted on exports of about 2.1 million hl.

The massive recourse to intervention measures, made necessary by the difficult market situation, led to an appreciable increase in expenditure over the previous year, when expenditure had been the lowest since 1974. In 1980, it amounted to 2.65% of total EAGGF guarantee expenditure, while vineyards accounted for 3% of the Community's UAA.

IV. TRADE

Trade in 1979/80 was, by and large, very much as in the previous year. There was almost no change in the clear predominance of internal over external trade. The level of imports remained the same, while exports increased distinctly. The result is an appreciable increase in the positive balance (in volume) of trade in the sector, which rose from 1 096 457 to 2 643 762 hl.

a) Intra-Community trade

After a considerable increase in the previous year, the total volume of intra-Community trade decreased appreciably (Tables 17 and 18). As regards individual Member States, there was a further increase in French shipments (up 23%) and those from Germany (up 13.3%), while in Italy there was a sharp fall of 25.6% as against the previous year. This latter was due essentially to a reduction in shipments to France (down 34.3%), and to a lesser extent Germany (down 11%), but it had been foreseen, in view of increased domestic availabilities in France as against the previous year. In 1979/80 French shipments reached record levels, and as France at the same time distinctly reduced its imports (down 34.3%) it again, after three years, had a positive balance in its intra-Community trade. Germany increased not only its exports but also its imports (up 12.3%), especially from France (up 49.5%). The other member countries' trade saw no major changes.

b) Imports

Despite very large quantities of Community produce available at low prices, imports in 1979/80 remained almost unchanged from the previous year (down 1.7%). This would seem to indicate that the pattern of imports is now steady, involving to a large extent kinds of wine not available in the Community. The countries from which exports came did not change. Spain, with 39.8% of the total (as against 39.1% in 1978/79), easily led the field. In second position was still Portugal (with 13.8% in 1979/80 against 14.2% in 1978/79), while third was Yugoslavia, steady at 8.7%. Hungary, whose exports to the Community are becoming every greater, moved up to fourth place (6.7%) followed by Austria (6.4%), imports from which are also rising regularly. Imports from Greece, on the other hand, fell appreciably, from 6.2% to 4.1%. Shipments from the Maghreb fell again, now amounting to only 9.9% of the total. Among the member countries, Germany strengthened its position as the main importer, its imports being up 6.9% on the previous year. Imports into all the other countries except Ireland fell.

c) Exports

Community exports, which had already risen by 19% in 1978/79, again increased substantially in 1979/80 (up 21.7%). Again this rise is mainly due to a 42.3% increase in Italian exports, French exports having risen slightly (up 1.9%) while German shipments fell back somewhat (down 5.5%). Some caution is necessary in assessing the excellent export figures, which include quantities exported with refunds: these increased sharply when refunds were changed in November 1979. This increase also affected the list of the Community's best customers, although there is no refund in respect of some of the countries concerned. Although the United States remained by far the biggest importer of Community wine (taking 38.9% of our

exports in 1979/80), the Soviet Union came forward to take second position (with 13.6% of the total) in front of Switzerland, whose imports fell slightly to 13.4%. Exports to Canada (8.6% of the total) rose slightly, as did those to Sweden. After a fall over a number of years, there was a slight rise in exports to Austria. There was a large increase in exports to black Africa, in particular the Ivory Coast, due to refunds.





(in million hectolitres)













Internal Uses of wine


Internal Uses of wine
(in million hectolitres)












