SUMMARY OF EUROFLASHES

January 1 to June 30, 1965

INTRODUCTION

This is the third in a series of six-monthly summaries of business penetration in the Common Market, and covers the operations recorded in *Opera Mundi - Europe* during the first half of 1965 (Nos. 286 to 310 inclusive). This is original work, setting out operations in each member country and also giving the relevant sectors of the economy, so that the reader can immediately appreciate the significance of each item. Any reader who is mainly concerned with a particular company or group can refer to the alphabetical index and see whether it has been involved on one or more occasions during the half-year; on the page indicated will be found a short description of the event and a reference to where the complete item was first published in the weekly issue.

Items are first classified geographically, because the formation of a real Common Market depends more on interpenetration between businesses in different countries than on that between the various sectors of the economy. The summary is therefore divided into five parts, each preceded by a table of contents: Belgium-and-Luxembourg, France, Germany, Italy and the Netherlands. Each "country" is divided into two chapters, one dealing with operations within the Community (that is, within the country), the other dealing with operations emanating from the country, but taking place outside the Community.

For instance, a Franco-German link-up resulting in a new company in France is listed in the first chapter under "France"; an Italian company forming a subsidiary in Belgium would appear in the first chapter of "Belgium-Luxembourg". If, on the other hand, a German firm sets up a subsidiary in Britain, this would appear in the second chapter of "West Germany", and an association between Italians and Luxembourgers, resulting in an American company being formed, would come both in the second chapter of "Italy" and in the second chapter of "Belgium-Luxembourg". Within each chapter we have classified the items by industries, and we have kept as closely as possible to the usual Euroflash classification; anything which does not fall under these headings or is too rare to justify a special heading of its own has been classified under "Various". Under each heading items are in chronological order.

Each item is followed by two figures giving the issue and page number of *Opera Mundi - Europe* where it is more fully described. The letter F before the reference number signifies the French editions, to which the reader should refer for news items published before the English edition of *Opera Mundi - Europe* was started in March, 1964.

(Very occasionally items have appeared in the French edition alone, and the reader will then find the reference number preceded by F also; the publishers will supply copies of these items in full, should readers need them).

Additional sections are included for Switzerland, Britain and USA, the three non-member countries most concerned in interpenetration with the Common Market.

We hope our readers will find this summary helpful and that they will inform us of any changes or improvements they consider useful.
