EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

At the end of the discussion by the Council on 21 June 1978, the Commission's representative undertook to submit an amendment regarding the allocation of catch quotas referred to in the proposal for a Council Regulation circulated under the code S/766/78.

The amendment relates to a new allocation of catch quotas amongst the Member States in respect of the following species : saithe, ling and blue ling. In addition an allocation of catch quotas, initially not provided for, is made in respect of the following species : flat fish and other species.

During the course of the discussions which took place at the Council on 24 April 1978, the Commission proposed Article 43 as the legal basis of this regulation instead of Article 103. Therefore it is necessary to amend two citations and delete a recital. The articles remain unchanged.

Amend the first citation as follows :

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community
and in particular Article 43 thereof,

Add a third citation,:

Having regard to the opinion of the European Parliament,

Delete the last recital

Replace the former annex by the following :
